
District 14 D- Details

A Message from District Governor Mike Schaeffer

Happy Spring Lions & Leos!

As the end of my District Governor term draws near, so does the monthly requirement for newsletter articles. Admittedly, at times, it can be a struggle to find new material that is relevant and engaging to our readers while still encouraging membership growth, service activities, and leadership development. I've even resorted to an article written completely by AI technology (Can you guess which one!). This month was one of those times I was fearing, until this past Thursday, when I witnessed something truly inspirational and satisfying.

I was invited to speak at a zone meeting about leadership opportunities and the importance of succession planning. I arrived to find the "regulars" most of whom were already leaders in their clubs either currently or previously. I was somewhat discouraged initially, wondering what I was going to be able to teach these veterans. The final lion to arrive, much to my surprise, was someone who had never attended a





We joked because I have tried for years to encourage him and others from that club to become more involved in district activities. I've harassed him, not quite to the level of criminal charges, to report service but to no avail. In previous conversations it was apparent that he and his fellow club members saw little to no value in district activities. I wondered what was so special about tonight's meeting that he decided to attend. I was thrilled to hear that a veteran lion from another club twisted his arm apparently harder than me. What happened next was one of the coolest things for me as a governor thus far.

For the next hour and a half, this lion engaged enthusiastically with the group on topics including fundraising successes and failures, general club challenges, leadership development, and membership recruitment ideas. He filled a page of notes to share with his club and mentioned several times how thankful he was that he decided to attend.

Towards the end, I learned of a community project that several clubs, including his, volunteer at and support. As the discussion progressed, I could see the excitement develop in him as he learned of additional grant funding opportunities available through NEPALSF, LOPF, and LCIF. He and I talked for almost an hour after the meeting, and it was awesome to hear the passion in his voice as he spoke about a project that obviously means so much to him. Earlier in the evening, I encouraged everyone to have a 60-second elevator speech for membership recruitment. He said, "Mike, you've never given me a good elevator speech as to why we should report service. You just did tonight, and I promise to report"!

A few important takeaways from the evening. 1) Zone meetings are vitally important to foster collaborative efforts in problem-solving, education, and new opportunities. 2) Leadership is so much more than titles. You don't have to be a DG, ZC, President, etc. to be a great communicator, mentor, cheerleader, and persuader. Just think of the missed opportunities if that veteran lion had not twisted his arm to come to the meeting! 3) We've all heard about the Bill and Melinda Gates story regarding LCIF, but it doesn't have a meaningful impact. Find projects/causes within the local community that are relevant if you want clubs to understand the importance of service reporting. 4) This story is a perfect example of how empowering Lions to pursue their passions can *Change The World*. 5) Know your audience- it never hurts to have beer!



Create a greener, cleaner environment.


Sharing our stories with the world.



We are transitioning to a completely online registration system.

Registration Opens February 1, 2024

Online Registrations:

- 1. PLEASE VISIT <u>BeaconLodge.org/online-registrations</u> TO COMPLETE OUR ONLINE REGISTRATION.
- 2. Choose the appropriate camp registration button/link and follow the online instructions provided along the way.

Paper Registration Packet:

- 1. Registrations are no longer automatically mailed out. If you need a paper copy mailed, please contact our office.
- 2. Complete and sign *all* forms (including the Physician's Form and the Photo/Video Release) in the registration packet make sure all information requested is provided, and all needed individuals sign all appropriate signature lines. *The Physician's form must be completed and signed by a licensed physician.*
- 3. Return the registration packet as soon as all forms are completed.
- 4. Registrations are *processed* once we have received all forms, the application/registration fee, *AND* we have entered the information in our online registration portal.
- 5. Sponsorship information must be completed and authorized by the sponsoring Club. If there is no indication that the club authorized the sponsorship, the club will be contacted to request verification.
 - 1. We encourage our campers to pay the camp registration fee; however, a Lions Club may also pay the camp registration fee for the camper.
- 6. Return the completed registration packet and registration/application fee to:

- 7. Only upon data entry completion of all completed registration forms (including the Physician's Form and the Photo/Video Release) into our online registration portal, and receipt of the registration fee, will the registration be processed.
- 8. Once the registration process has been completed <u>and then approved</u>, the camper is considered registered and will receive a final confirmation email.
- a. The final confirmation will include information regarding camp arrival and departure times, a reminder of medication instructions, mailing instructions for letters and packages for campers, guidelines, and camp rules. A clothing inventory checklist will also be included; the checklist is to be printed, filled out, and packed with all the clothing and supplies the camper is bringing to camp.






