A Message from District Governor Bob Eberly

Leos, Lionesses, and Lions,

Our membership was looking grim, but many clubs have started to bring in new members. We have brought in 31 members but lost 45, so we are down 14. As we bring in new members, we must do all we can to keep them. Make sure their sponsors, and other club members, keep the new Lions informed as well as oriented to the ways of your club and LCI. Consider the Mentor Program to assist. Contact the GLT for information.

Several actions were taken at the Council Meeting at Grantville on Oct. 29 that must be shared. Not since 1993 has the State Lions increased the dues. State Council recommended to put on the State Convention ballot a state dues increase of \$1.50 starting July 1, 2012, and another \$1.50 on July 1, 2013. State Council endorsed Joe Preston from Arizona as a candidate for 2nd Vice International President. State committees were created. One committee is considering rotating our annual State Convention among the three state regions. Another committee is looking into redistricting the state. As districts drop below 1,250 members, the district loses opportunities from LCI. 14-D has over 1,650 members, so we are not endangered, but what happens with the other districts may affect 14-D.

Last month the District Governor's Honor Roll was created. Clubs that have planted trees, brought in new members, and paid their 100% District Contributions are recognized for their efforts. The list will grow each month as clubs join the list.

If your club could use new members, here is an idea that may help. Go to the LCI home page, click on Members Center, then click on Leadership Development, then click on Development Programs, and finally find Webinar and click on it. You will see that in January there will be a Webinar on Recruiting New Members. You can sign up for the 11th, 17th, or 20th. You will also see additional webinars that have passed and are coming up. Try a webinar; you will find that they are very well done and helpful.

The trip to Northeast Lions Eye Bank has been moved to March 24th. See the flyer in this newsletter for details. Also, start getting your bowling team together for the March 4th District Bowling Tournament.

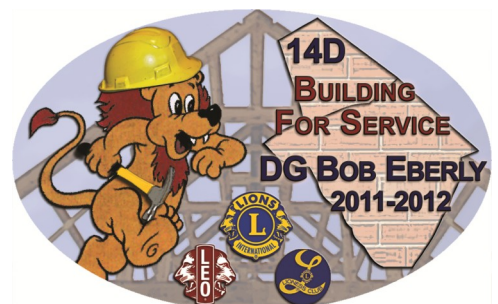

State Lions Per Capita Tax (Dues) Increase

Our Multiple District has always operated very conservatively and efficiently. The only source of income is the annually per capita dues paid by each Lion in the state.

The last time we had a dues increase was 1993. The Multiple District at the time had 34,000 Lions in over 900 Lions Clubs and only 162 Lions Clubs under 20 members. Today, 19 years later, our Multiple District has 22,984 members 775 Lions Clubs and about 20% or more of the clubs under 20 members. Three years ago, to avoid a dues increase the Council of Governors cut all the discretionary funds out of the budget, downsizing some committees, changing the structure of the state council meetings, and streamlining the entire operation of the Multiple District.

Our Multiple District By-Laws states: The Council of Governors shall have control and management of all budgetary matters of the Multiple District and Multiple District Convention. No obligation may be approved or made which shall effect an unbalanced budget or deficit in any fiscal year.

The Finance committee met with our auditor and investment committee chairperson and reviewed the audit for the 2010-2011 year, and the group agreed to propose a dues increase to the Lions of Pennsylvania. If we do not increase our per capita dues, the State Council of Lions Clubs will not be able to present a balanced budget as outlined in the By-Laws.

The Finance Committee has proposed a \$3.00 increase over the next 2 years. The increase will be as follows: \$1.50 beginning July 1, 2012, and \$1.50 beginning July 1, 2013. The dues increase has the support of the Council of Governors. The proposed increase will only amount to ½ cent per day per Lion. The increase will be divided into the following accounts: State Council Administrative Fund \$1.00, State Convention Fund .20 cents, International Convention Fund .20 cents, Promotional Fund .10 cents, Sub-District Administrative Fund .50 cents, and the Pride Magazine (State newsletter) \$1.00.

How will the proposed increase benefit the Lions of Pennsylvania?

1. The State Council Administrative Fund increase will provide ample funds to perform the administrative duties of the Multiple District.
2. The State Convention Fund increase will help defray any increase in the state convention registration fees.
3. The International Convention Fund's small increase will assure a visible presence of the Lions of Pennsylvania at the international convention.
4. The Promotional Fund increase will help provide ample funds to promote candidates for the office of International Director.
5. The Sub-district Administrative Fund increase will give each district more funds to help operate the sub-district.
6. The State Newsletter (Pride Magazine) increase will solve the annual deficit and keep the publication solvent for the future.

The dues increase assures the Lions of our Multiple District that we will remain solvent in the future, and it will keep our Multiple District as one of the leaders in Lionism throughout the world.

The State Council of Governors and the PA Counsellors organization voted unanimously to support the proposed dues increase.

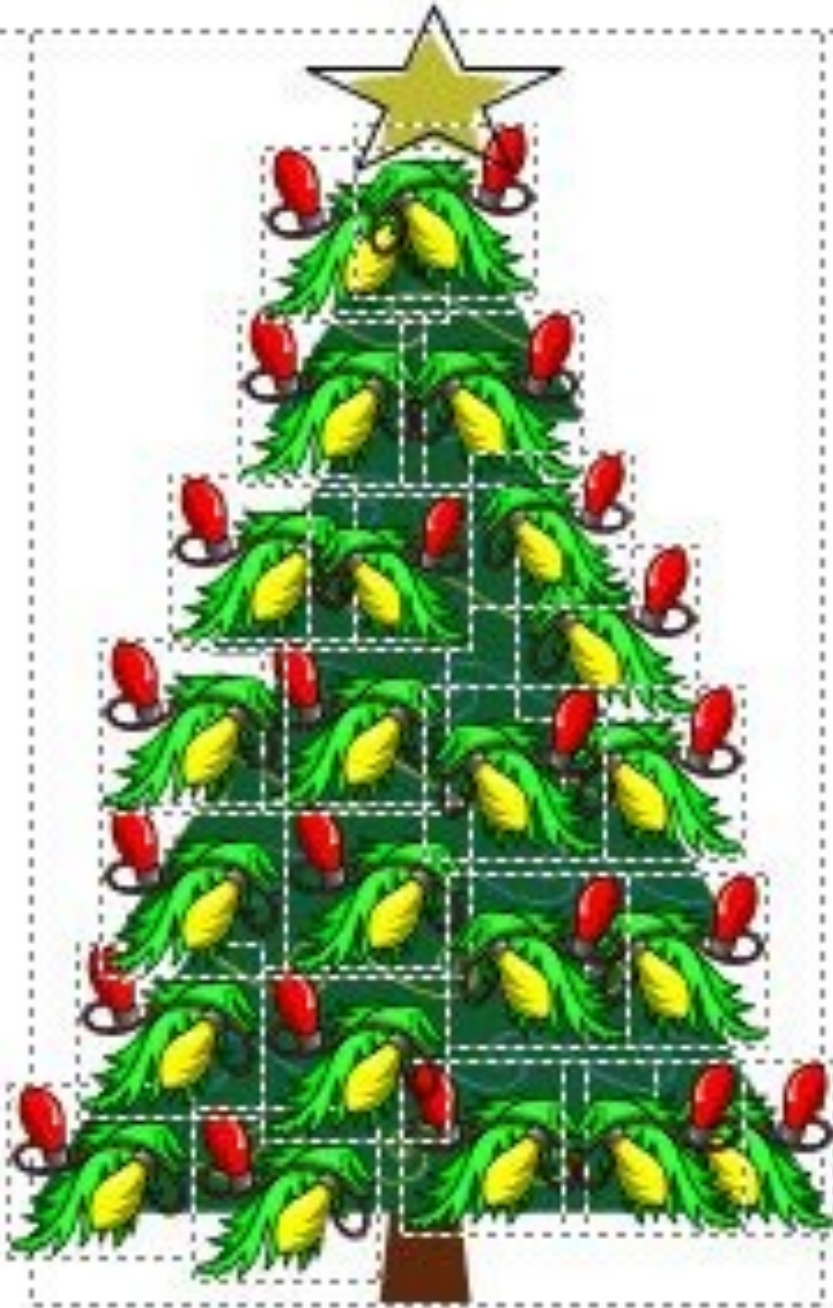

The club donated \$100 to Lion Ernie Heisey toward the care of his Leader Dog puppy, mailed packages to their Adopt-a-Chaplain, donated \$200 in gifts to residents at Wernersville State Hospital, baked goods to Lebanon VA Hospice family Thanksgiving dinner, and food to the Lebanon Food Bank.

Lancaster Lions will visit Conestoga View on Sat., Dec. 10, to share holiday greetings with the residents.

Lititz Lions Club recently honored Lion Dann Barkume as Lion of the Year, Lion Bill Raines for Distinguished Service, and Lion Amanda Cassel for her service as club president last year.

Mount Joy Lions concluded two major fundraisers recently – their annual Christmas wreath sale and their Merchandise Club program. Profit from these projects will be used to fund the club's community service projects.

New Holland Lions helped two people get eye exams and glasses, held a food drive at Yoder's Market to benefit the New Holland Food Bank (collected about 1,325 pounds of food and \$312), and donated \$4,000 to the New Holland Police Department for the purchase of a camera for one of the squad cars.

Quarryville Lions will honor veterans during the regular club meeting on Monday, Dec. 12, and will ring bells for the Salvation Army from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sat., Dec. 17, at Ferguson Hasslers.

Wakefield Lions donated \$4,020 to the DG's suggested charities, \$250 to Canine Partners for Life, \$200 to the Lancaster Folk Music Society, \$795 to the Young Marines of Lancaster County, \$2,000 to the Quarryville Library, and \$5,000 each to Robert Fulton Fire Company and Wakefield Ambulance. The club raises funds through their catering service.

CEP covers the following Characteristics of an Excellent Club:

- Service-minded
- Good Communication
- Strong Membership Program
- Retention of Members
- Effective Leadership and Club Operations

CEP is a four-part process workshop that is led by trained, experienced Lions and can be customized to meet the needs of your club. The process covers community needs, the above characteristics of an excellent club, obstacles to excellence, locating resources, goal setting and action plans.

The workshop can be completed in one or four sessions and can be scheduled for club meetings or other gatherings over a period of time.

Learn How to Identify a Phishing Email

Recently, a member of the District Cabinet and many of his fellow Lions were victims of “Phishing.” Phishing is a way of attempting to acquire information such as usernames, passwords, and credit card details by masquerading as a trustworthy entity in an electronic communication such as an email message. These e-mails sometimes appear very real, even when they’re not. Phishing allows criminals to use your personal information for their own benefit or profit.

Have you seen a phishing attempt? Almost everyone has. That’s why it’s important to look for clues to identify whether the message is legitimate or a scam. Following is an example of a Phishing email with clues and details for you to look for.

The expiration date on your card is about to expire. **(4)** Please help us update our records as soon as possible to avoid cancellation of your Internet service and e-mail account.

Click **(5)** [here](#) to provide the **(6)** necessary information. **(7)** You will need your e-mail name, password, credit card number and expiration date.

Thank you for your patience as we work together to protect your account. **(8)**

- (1)** A message from most reputable sources would not come from hotmail or another free e-mail account.
- (2)** A logo can make the message look authentic, but anyone can copy and paste an image just as I did here.
- (3)** Don’t be fooled just because the sender uses your real name. The message can still be from a stranger across the street, across the country or around the world.
- (4)** An informational e-mail will not ask you to respond. Phishers generally create a sense of urgency for you to reply
- (5)** Click-on links can be fake. In other words, they may not direct you to the website they appear to represent. Unless these are clearly stated addresses (and even they can be deceiving), never click on a hyperlink.
- (6)** Misspelled words and grammatical errors are often an immediate tip-off that the message is likely a phishing attempt.
- (7)** No respectable organization or company will ask you for your social security number, account numbers, password, or date of birth in an e-mail.
- (8)** If the message does not contain alternate contact information, such as a telephone number, that matches your credit card or billing statement, it is likely a scam.

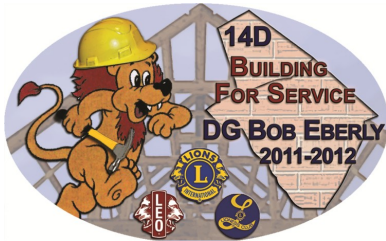
