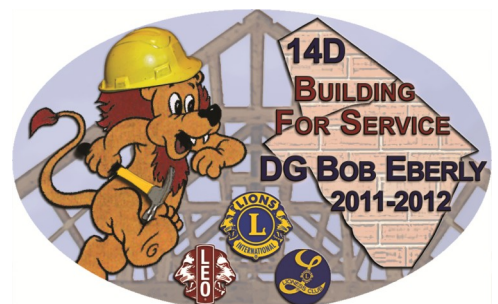

## New LCI payment options are now available online!

Have you heard the news? WMMR, the online membership and service activity reporting system, is being updated to better serve you. The updates are now available. These features, except the payment function, are available to All Club Officers. The payment option is available to Club Treasurers. These new features will allow you to:

- View your club statements online from January 2011 through the present time for a rolling 3-year period.
- Pay online with credit cards for on-time payments.
- View your Semi-Annual Per-Capita invoices online for a rolling 3-year period.
- Review your monthly statements for payment and membership updates.

How will this new feature affect your club and the Association?

- View your statement online as soon as it becomes available and avoid postal delays.
- Pay your total statement balance timely and protect your Good Standing.
- Receive an emailed confirmation of your online payment.
- Go Green! Choose to stop receiving mailed statements starting October 2011.

FAQ: (Frequently Asked Questions)

Q: Am I required to change the manner in which regular payments are sent?

A: No, it is not mandatory to pay online. This is an option offered to all club officers.

Q: Can I view payments not issued online?

A: Yes, non-online payments can be viewed on the end-of-month statements once they are available.

Q: When can I view my online statement?

A: Your online statement can be viewed after the 3rd or 4th business day following month-end close.

Q: Can District and Multiple District Statements be viewed and paid online?

A: District and Multiple District Statements are not yet available online at this time.

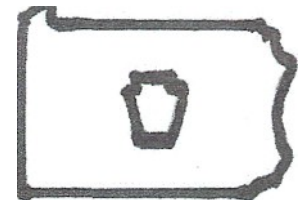

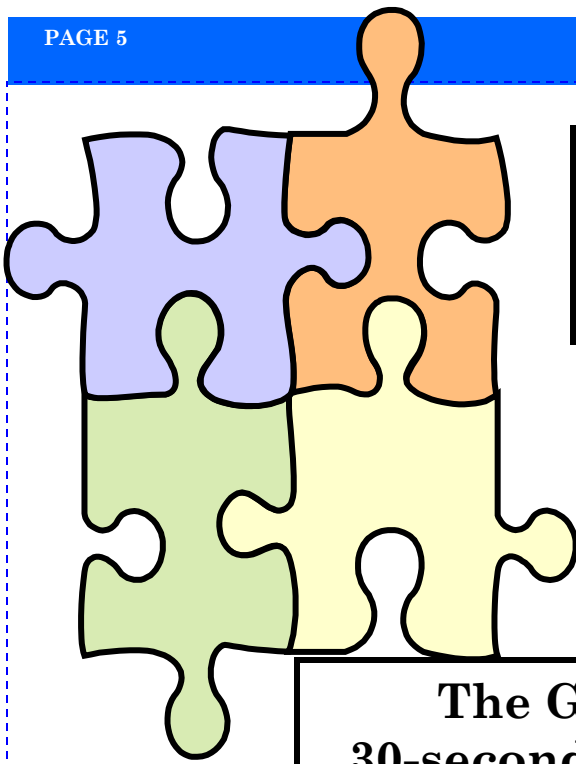

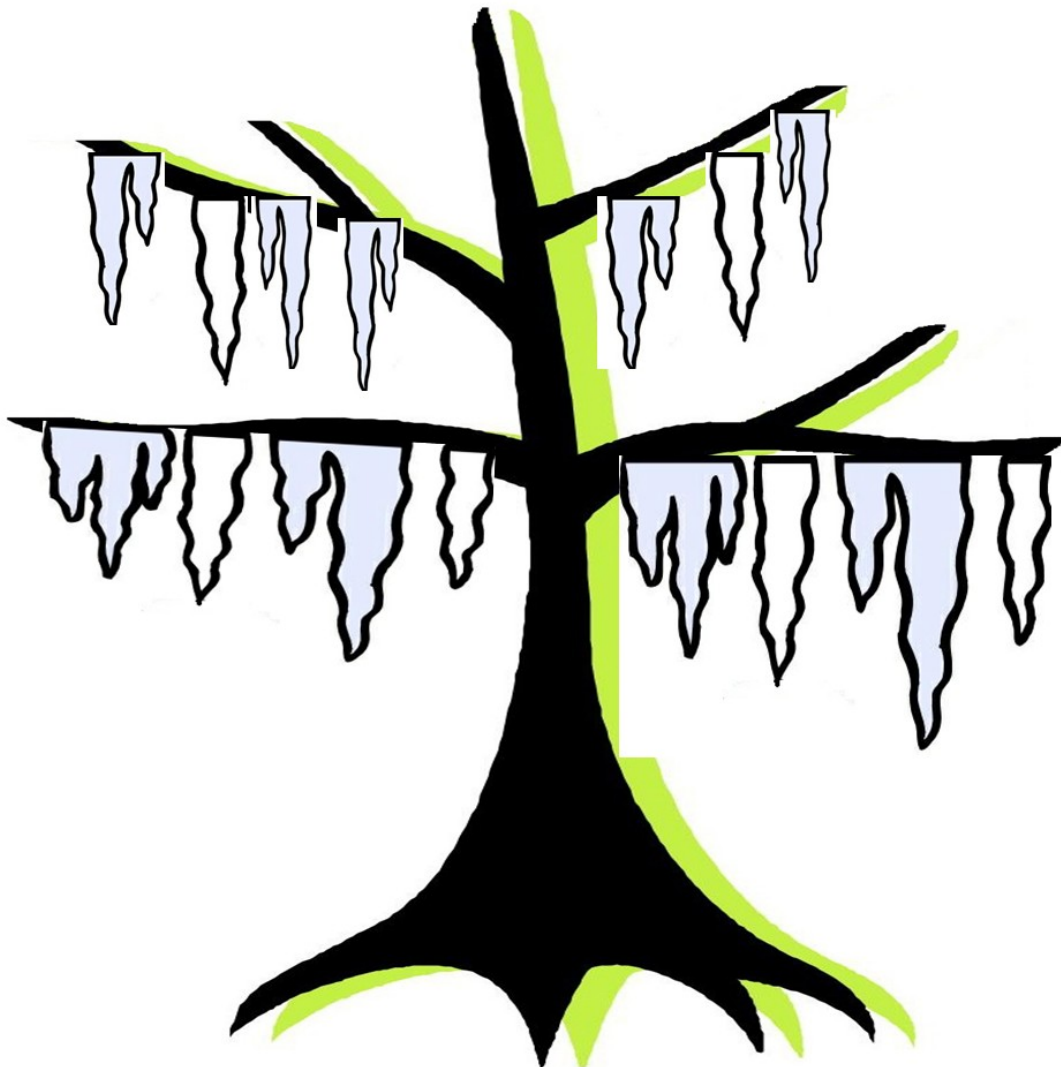

## Lion Jim Groff Honored for Service in Joplin, MO

### Offers to Present Program to Clubs

Christiana Lions Club president Jim Groff has been honored for his work in cleanup efforts following the tornado that hit Joplin, Missouri, last May 22. Past International President Sid Scruggs presented Lion Groff with the International President's Leadership Award and a Beacon of Hope coin. International President Wing-Kun Tam awarded Groff a Certificate of Appreciation for "distinguished achievement in fulfilling the mission of LCI" and the president's pin.

The awards recognize Lion Jim's outstanding actions to assist Lions in Multiple District 26. After an F5 tornado caused widespread damage in Joplin, Lion Jim was moved by the scenes shown in news reports. The tornado tore a mile-wide path 14 miles long through a residential area, striking 7,829 homes, eight schools, and a nine-story hospital, which was moved four inches off its foundation by winds reaching 400 miles an hour. The homes of seven Lions club members were among those destroyed, as were the homes of 61 visually impaired families. Over a thousand people were injured, 162 lives were lost, 18,000 vehicles were destroyed, and the education of 7,747 children was interrupted.

Deciding to take action, Lion Jim called Lions International and was given the phone number of MD26 PDG Debbie Whittlesby. Recruiting a friend, Glenn DeHart, he gathered supplies and food and headed for Joplin. The trip took 22 hours, and the pair were unprepared for the destruction that greeted them when they arrived. Nevertheless, they set to work alongside Lions from Missouri and Kansas and spent a week tearing down buildings. Because he had traveled so far to help out, his efforts were noticed by PIP Scruggs, who invited Lion Jim to take part in a video made by LCI.

Lion Jim is preparing a documentary about his experience and is **eager to share his story and the documentary or a slide presentation with clubs in 14-D. To schedule a visit to your club, call him at 610-593-6612 or 610-636-2616.**

And Lion Jim has an ulterior motive: Not one to rest on any laurels, he is making plans to take teams of Pennsylvania Lions to Joplin in May and June to help rebuild the homes he helped to tear down last summer. More information about this project will follow, but all Lions of 14-D are urged to begin now to think about how they can be involved in this service project. Lions with construction skills and experience will be needed, but people willing to cook and prepare meals for the construction teams (using a trailer owned by Joplin Lions) will also be needed. Call Lion Jim at the numbers above to discuss how your club can help with this project, one which surely epitomizes our motto: We Serve!

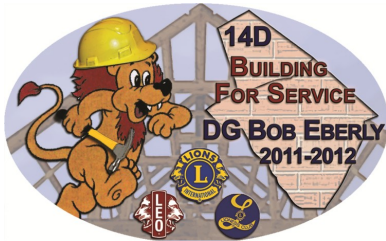

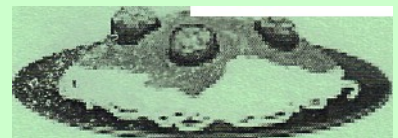
