Thoughts From District Governor Deb

Lions, Lionesses, and Leos,

At our last Cabinet meeting we held a workshop entitled "Ask One", "Keep One", "Start One". These 3 simple statements say a lot about the future of Lions and what we must do to see our service to our communities continue for many years to come. We must constantly revitalize our clubs to allow them to offer the quality service that our communities have come to expect.

Have you asked someone to become a Lion this week? The most common reason people give when asked why they are not a Lion is "no one ever asked me". I know we all fear rejection when we put ourselves out there and ask someone to become a Lion but we must remember that if at first you don't succeed, try, try again! Many Lions will tell you that they were asked several times before they finally decided to join a Lions Club but once they did there was no looking back and that it was one of the best decisions they ever made.

Have you called one of your absent members this week to see how they are doing? Just as important as bringing in new members is keeping the members we already have. When members feel cared for by fellow members they are more likely to remain in the family of your Lions Club. Have you helped a new Lion get to know the other members in your club? These are all ways we can help keep the members we already have and allow them to have a meaningful experience with the other Lions of their Club.

The last and most feared way to build our Lions District is the dreaded "Start One". We are talking about starting new clubs in our area to help meet the needs of ever growing communities. Many Clubs do not feel that new clubs need to be started but that could not be further from the truth. Many potential members want to have the opportunity to explore their own ideas and do not want to mold to the ways of a long standing club. There is nothing wrong with the older established clubs doing things their way as we need to blend the new and the old ways to always keep Lions membership fresh and appealing. Consider what an honor it would be for your Club to sponsor a new club and infuse your local community with many more hands to serve. Probably many more hands than you would be able to provide in your existing club. I can tell you from personal experience that helping to start a new club was one of the most rewarding experiences I have had as a Lion. I would love for all the Lions out there to have this experience.

Let's get our District moving in a positive direction by Asking One, Keeping One, and Starting One. "Imagine the Possibilities"



The 2015 District 14-D Convention is rapidly approaching. The date of the convention is March 28, 2015, and it will be held at Cedar Crest Middle School.

As always, there is a cost to the District to sponsor an event such as this. To help offset this cost, we again are asking all the clubs in District 14-D to put together a "Theme" basket and donate it to the District Convention.

For those clubs who might not be familiar with this fundraiser, this is how it works: An assortment of items with a common "Theme" are placed in a basket and covered with a clear wrapping. Strips of tickets are then sold and placed in containers that are in front of each basket. A ticket then is pulled from each container and whoever has that ticket gets to take that "Theme" basket home.

Some common "Themes" that previous baskets consisted of were Gardening, Lottery Tickets, Food, Golf, Wine, Money, and even a Bologna theme. These items do not necessarily have to be placed in a basket and may consist of one large item such as a grill or a small television. Baskets that are filled with items that are produced locally are always a big hit. Each basket should be worth around \$50.00.



How to Avoid Being Hooked in a Phishing Expedition

It appears North Korea used phishing to break into Sony's systems. Not the old fashioned rod and reel type, but a modern day, highly organized phishing attack. By getting a Sony employee to click on a link, they were able to hack into Sony's systems and find out everything from future movie plans, actors' salaries and contact information to company financials and legal information.

So what is phishing? Phishing occurs when a perpetrator tries to get you to click on something or disclose information that will allow them access to your computer and network. Much as the name suggests, just like the old fashioned fishing, this typically works by dangling some kind of bait in front of you. By clicking on a phishing link or opening a malicious attachment, your computer can become infected with something nasty. Or it could lead to your unknowingly giving a criminal your password for a site.

To keep yourself safe, here are a few tips to keep in mind:

Check the sender email address

Be mindful of who is emailing you. Check email addresses for accuracy and look for signs of suspicious activity – the email is not in the format you'd expect or the name is misspelled.

Don't click on links

Hover over links WITHOUT CLICKING — the destination will show in the bottom left of your screen and you can see whether it looks legitimate.

Don't open attachments you didn't request

Treat any attachment that you didn't request as highly suspect.

It is incredibly easy to get caught by a well-crafted phishing campaign. Remember, if you see something that doesn't seem right, it probably isn't.
