#### NORTHEAST PALIONS EYE BANK UPDATE

In accordance with Pennsylvania Law, after legal notice was provided to the membership, (82) Lions registered at the Wednesday, August 19th Lions membership meeting at the Best Western Premiere, 800 East Park Drive in Harrisburg for the Northeast Pennsylvania Lions Eye Bank, Inc. A quorum was established. The Membership (Lions members of Districts H, W, G, U, K, L, T, C & D) met and voted by secret ballot. The vote was overwhelming **in favor (only 13 "no" votes)** of moving forward consistent with the Plan of Asset Transfer of the Northeast Pennsylvania Lions Eye Bank, Inc. to SightLife which had been approved by the Board of Directors.

The next steps are to have a formal contract signed between SightLife and the Eye Bank and then pursue and obtain approval from the Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Court of Common Pleas of Northampton County.

#### How Are You Doing?

Evaluation is key. If members are not excited, a simple survey of members could tell the reason. The LCI website contains a newly revised "How Are Your Ratings?" survey program. This program provides a simple survey.

#### Club Meeting Up-grade.

Club meetings are critical to the success of your club. It is easy to recruit new members when you invite them to meetings that are welcoming and enjoyable. Positive and engaging meetings encourage involvement, facilitate communication and give members something to look forward to. But how do you design a meeting that appeals to members and prospective members who want to make a difference in their community, but have little time to commit? And how do you create a club atmosphere that is positive and inviting?

You have a choice...Your club has the freedom to structure club meetings in a way that best meets your members' needs. While many clubs value the traditions that have been passed down from generation to generation, it is good to know that most traditions are optional and members can chose to change the elements, frequency, and structure of their meetings to make the meeting more inviting and/or use new forms of technology to keep members connected and manage club business.

#### Be Relevant!

Nothing is more important to your club than being a vital service provider to your community. Is your club doing relevant service projects locally?

There are many resources available to help your club choose and develop relevant community service. LCI's website has a whole page devoted to service project resources.

Likewise, you may need to know what the needs are in your community—and let community leaders know your interest. A Community Needs Assessment is great tool to use.

#### Recognition and Fulfillment

Members like to know they are making a difference. Likewise then need a good "pat on the back" for doing good. It is key that members know the difference they make: bring those that benefit from your club's projects to a club meeting. Also giving the members recognition is vital. LCI has a guide on the "Art of Recognition" that reminds us that expensive awards are not critical to making members feel important.

#### Share the Fun.

Building stronger communities through effective Lions Clubs is very rewarding. But the message needs to be shared. While there a many ways to spread the word about what we do-and the fun we have doing it, we need to take a new approach with our message.

- **View Latest Lions Quarterly:** This link takes you to International's "Lions Quarterly Video Magazine" which shares inspiring stories of how Lions make a difference in communities around the world.
- International Newsletters: This takes you to a List of current and Previous Newsletters provided by International. Among the newsletters included are Leader Network Newsletter, LCIF Newsletter, Membership Pulse and Family and Women's Newsletter.
- July/August Digital Lion Magazine: Links to an Online Version of the Current Lion Magazine
- Past Digital Lion Magazines: This is a link to allow you to look at past issues of the Lion Magazine
- **2015-2016 International President's Theme Page:** Links to the Current International President Theme Page with has many Publications and Information on this theme
- Executive Board Summary: This Link contain a summary of decisions and results from the latest International Board of Directors Meeting.

#### 28th Annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest



Sponsor a Lions International Peace Poster Contest and join clubs worldwide in sharing children's visions of peace with your community.

#### How the Contest Works

Only a Lions club can sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2015. Participating students are asked to create posters visually depicting the contest theme, "Share Peace."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judging. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the multiple district competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International Headquarters for the final judging. Entries are judged at all levels on originality, artistic merit and portrayal of theme.

During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prize winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

#### Awards

Artists of posters advancing to the final international judging are recognized as follows:

- International Grand Prize Winner receives a trip to an award ceremony where he/she will receive a cash award of US\$5,000 (or local equivalent) and an engraved plaque. Two family members (one being the winner's parent or legal guardian) and the sponsoring Lions club president or a club member (as designated by the club president) will accompany the winner to the award ceremony.
- 23 Merit Award Winners each receive a cash award of US\$500 (or local equivalent) and a certificate of achievement.
