

## **Lions of Pennsylvania Foundation**

The 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Lions of Pennsylvania Foundation was held October 28, 2016 at the Holiday Inn, in Grantville. Our annual banquet was a great success. We had over 125 in attendance. Entertainment was "Cormorants Fancy", Music of Ireland, Scotland and the Celtic Nations.

PDG Rodney W. Sweger was honored with a plaque recognizing his 20+ years of service to the Lions of Pennsylvania Foundation.

A Board meeting was held Saturday morning and a grant was approved to 14F for \$5,000. It was reported there are 2013 Fellows in PA and District 14D has a total of 352.

Lion Mark Tomco also reviewed the report of our investments showing we had a gain of 5.91% in our Fellows Account. The current balance is \$1,348,815. The interest on the funds received for these Fellows is the money that is awarded in grants. Grant money available for this year was over \$89,000 with approximately \$75,000 left in grants.

As a point of information, the Foundation accepts requests for the cameras for the Kid Sight Program. For each District request we will approve a \$2,000 grant.

### **MENDOZA EARNS FIRST-PLACE AWARD IN LIONS CLUBS' STATE PEACE POSTER CONTEST**

**HARRISBURG, Pa.** – Karen Mendoza, an eighth-grade student at Wilson West Middle School and resident of Sinking Spring, has been selected as the Multiple District 14 (Pennsylvania) winner of Lions Clubs International's annual Peace Poster Contest. The theme of this year's contest was "A Celebration of Peace."

In recognition of being selected as the MD-14 winner, Mendoza will receive a check for \$250 and a trophy and will be considered for the grand prize of \$5,000 presented to the winner of the Lions Clubs International contest. Merit awards of \$500 in cash will also be presented to 23 recipients.

Prior to winning the best-in-the-state honor, Mendoza was crowned as one of the state's 17 district winners. Mendoza won the District 14-P contest that included entries from students 11 through 13 years of age at schools located in Berks and Chester counties.

Mendoza's entry was sponsored by the Spring Township Lions Club based in the West Lawn section of Reading.

Brooke Yarnall, a seventh-grader at Bedford Middle School in Bedford, was selected as the second-place finisher in this year's MD-14 competition, one year after she had placed third in the 2015 competition. Yarnall's entry was sponsored by the Bedford Lions Club and was selected for the second consecutive year as the District 14-L (Bedford, Blair, Fulton, Huntingdon and Mifflin counties) winner prior to the state competition. As the second-place finisher in this year's state competition, Yarnall will receive a \$150 check and a trophy.

Jessy Bruzgulis, an eighth-grade student at Crestwood Middle School in Mountain Top, was named as the third-place finisher this year. Bruzgulis' entry was sponsored by the Joseph L. Wroblewski Mountain Laurel Lions Club. Bruzgulis was selected as the District 14-W (Luzerne County) winner prior to the state competition. As the third-place finisher in this year's state competition, Bruzgulis will receive a \$100 check and a trophy.

Honorable mention recognition this year went to Arianne Lao, a sixth-grade student at Upper Perkiomen Middle School in Pennsburg (sponsored by Upper Perkiomen Valley Lions Club, District 14-A); Delia McCurdy, an eighth-grade student at Charleroi Area Middle School in Charleroi (sponsored by the Charleroi Lions Club, District 14-M) and Alexandra Walton, a seventh-grade student at Norwin Middle School in North Huntingdon (sponsored by Stewartsville Lions Club, District 14-E).

Prior to being selected as an honorable mention award winner, McCurdy was named for the second consecutive year as the District 14-M (Fayette, Greene, Somerset and Washington counties) winner.

Each honorable mention selection will receive a trophy provided by the PA State Council of Lions Club, which is based in Harrisburg.

Judging for this year's contest was coordinated by Bruce Wall, Professor of Art, Fine Art Program at Northampton Community College in Bethlehem.

Lions Clubs International's Multiple District 14 consists of more than 700 clubs divided into 17 sub-districts throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. With over 19,000 members, MD-14 ranks as the third-largest multiple district in the world's largest service club organization (1.4 million members in 46,000 clubs located in 200 countries and geographical areas).

Since its foundation in 1917, Lions clubs have aided the blind and visually impaired and made a strong commitment to community service and serving youth throughout the world.





# Centennial Community Legacy Projects FAQ



## Q1. What is a Centennial Community Legacy Project?

- A1. Centennial Community Legacy Projects are visible gifts that help clubs connect with their communities and create lasting Lions legacies. If you can put a plaque on it, it's a Legacy Project. With three levels of participation, there's an opportunity for every club to get involved.

**NOTE:** *Legacy Projects can be completed in a community other than your own.*

## Q2. What are the three levels of Community Legacy Projects?

- A2. There are three levels of Legacy Projects, with increasing levels of size and impact. Clubs should choose the level that's right for their club and community:

Level 1: Raise Your Community Visibility – a public item such as donating a park bench, bike rack or a new sign

Level 2: Provide a Community Gift – a larger contribution such as refurbishing a park, establishing a community garden or providing medical equipment

Level 3: Make a Community Impact – a significant community impact such as building a clinic, school, eye-hospital or library

*All Legacy Projects should be identified with a sign or plaque indicating the project was donated by a Lions club.*

## Q3. When can my club complete its Centennial Community Legacy Project?

- A3. Anytime during the Centennial Celebration Program, from July 2014 through June 2018.

## Q4. Do Legacy Projects qualify for the Centennial Service Challenge?

- A4. Legacy Projects qualify if they also provide benefits under one of the four Centennial Service Challenge areas: hunger, youth, vision or the environment. For example, if you build a children's park in your community, you could enter it as both a Legacy Project and as a Centennial Service Challenge activity.

## Q5. How do I report my Centennial Community Legacy Project?

- A5. You report Legacy Projects just like you report your Centennial Service Challenge activities – by using MyLCI's Service Activity Report, under the *Community and Culture* activity type.
