

Nomination and Selection of District Melvin Jones Fellowship <u>Request for Nominations</u>

PURPOSE

To provide guidelines on the nomination and selection process of District 14-D for a Melvin Jones Fellowship to be presented to a Lon from each Region and a Lioness.

GENERAL GUIDELINES TO SUBMIT A NOMINATION

- Each Lionistic year, District 14-D may present a Melvin Jones Fellowship to a Lion per Region along with a Lioness based on nominations from the Lions and Lioness Clubs in the District.
- 2. Nominations pertain to new Melvin Jones Fellowships only and not Progressive Fellowships.
- The LCIF Chairperson must submit information and instructions in the District Newsletter, along with a stated deadline, as to how to nominate a Lion and or Lioness. This must be submitted to the newsletter editor as least two months before the deadline.
- Only Clubs that have contributed 100% of the District Governor's goals to the District as per the Contribution Schedule, qualifying the Club as a 100% Club, may submit a nominee for a District Melvin Jones Fellowship.
- All nominations must be Board approved and signed by either the Club President or Club Secretary, preferably by the Club President when possible.
- All nominations <u>must</u> be submitted on club stationery providing the qualifications of the nominee and sent to the LCIF Chairperson and a copy sent to the District Secretary by the established deadline.
- 7. Within a month after the deadline, the LCIF Chairperson must call a meeting and based on the received nominations, select the Lion / Lioness from each Region and Lioness Clubs that will receive a Melvin Jones Fellowship from District 14-D. The final decision will be made by a Committee consisting of the District Governor, the last Past District Governor from each Region, Cabinet Secretary and Cabinet Treasurer.

Note: The process will be: the above Lions will assess those nominations received in each Region, assigning 1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc. positions to each nomination with the #1 position will receive the Melvin Jones Fellowship. If there are extra dollars available for awards, the #2 etc. will be considered for the remaining awards.

- * The 1st Vice District Governor, 2nd Vice District Governor, LCIF Chairperson, Lioness Coordinator, and the Region Chairpersons will also be present to give input on any nomination that they know. They do not have voting rights.
- * The District Governor at the time of the selection process will present the Melvin Jones Fellowships at a later date, preferably at the following year's Region Rallies when he / she is the Immediate Past Dis trict Governor.

100TH CONVENTION WILL BE ONE-OF-A-KIND

Lions often declare after an international convention: "greatest ever." Chances are they'll be saying in July: "the greatest ever.—ever." The 100th International Convention, set for June 30 to July 4 in Chicago, will be an extravaganza and then some. On tap is an all-star lineup of entertainers and speakers, a stirring torch ceremony to mark the centennial, and, on the last day, signifying that Lions are now looking ahead to their next 100 years, the official announcement of a new service focus (supplementing, not replacing current efforts) and the LCI Forward plan.

Chances are they'll be saying in July: 'the greatest ever—ever.'

Performing at the convention will be Chicago, the Beach Boys, the Charlie Daniels Band, Patti LaBelle, David Archuleta of "American Idol" fame, American English (a Beatles cover band), Anna Fermin, the Blues Brothers Revue, the African Children's Choir and Edward and Belinda Lee, Former U.S. Vice President Al Gore will be the keynoter. Keller Johnson-Thompson, Helen Keller's great-grandniece, will also speak.

The centennial will be front and center at the convention, and Lions will be active participants in the celebration. During the torch ceremony at the first plenary session, Lions will be given their own mini-torches. The convention hall will feature a dazzling centennial exhibit, unpacking the wonderful history of Lions through interactive and virtual displays.

The gathering in Chicago also will include all the usual elements of convention: the Parade of Nations (on State Street, that great street, no less), the flag ceremony, voting for international officers and directors, seminars and endless opportunities to meet with Lions from across the world. Lions also can book bus tours to Lions' beadquarters in Oak Brook or to founder Melvin Jones' remade gravesite in the south suburbs. An option for sports fan is to purchase a ticket for the White Sox game against the Yankees on Thursday, June 29.

Convention is a capstone experience for Lions. Members learn about other club and district projects and make personal connections with international leaders and representatives from headquarters. The week together allows Lions to fully appreciate what it means to be a Lion and what our service accomplishes. At this convention, members will understand and celebrate what Lions have achieved over the last 100 years.

Digital LION

What's a convention in Chicago like? Pretty spectacular. In 2007 Lions were treated to a ghostly oration from Helen Keller, the melodic hits of Glen Campbell and a rousing gospel choir (Oct. 2007 LION). In 1967, the 50th anniversary of Lions Clubs, 48,586 Lions and guests attended the convention and heard from illustrious speakers including U.S. Secretary of State Dean Rusk and film star Dorothy Lamour (July/August 1967 LION). The parade down Michigan Avenue at the 1953 convention drew a crowd of 300,000, and Helen Keller spoke to Lions (September 1953 LION). Read these stories at lionmagazine.org.






