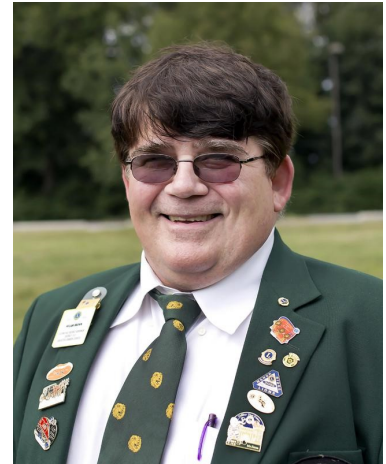
Well my training is still going on, I had a session with PA Lions Foundation. Can't wait for Council Meeting in Aug.

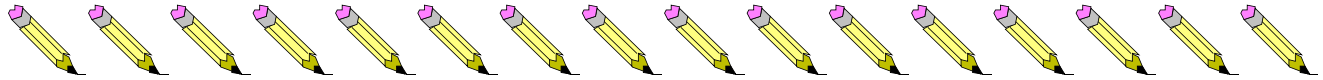

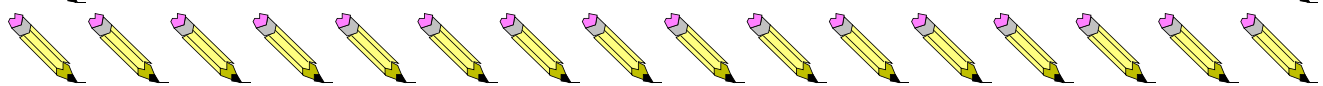
