
The fundraiser for the project is a "Paint and Sip" party at Painting with a Twist which is located at 174 South Centerville Road, Lancaster, PA.



We soon realized that IP Soliva was answering for her, until a group of women shouted, "Let her speak for herself!" (Women have come a long way, "I am woman, hear me ROAR!) At one point a Lioness shouted, "Why were the Lioness' dropped?" Control was lost at that point, all the women chimed in, "WHY?" PIP Banker moved in back of IP Soliva, I think he thought we would rush the podium! (I asked another Lion recently if Banker was actually the one who did the deed & was told that he couldn't find that he was, however that is the one we were always told did IT. That day he sure looked scared & guilty. (PIP Banker recently passed away.)

The reason I am recounting this event to you is that even though we are no longer recognized by International, we play a role in the District of serving those less fortunate. We owe it to ourselves to keep up with how the world of Lionism is contributing to the world as a whole, knowing that we are a part of that effort. Some of the District Lioness' have dual memberships, which opens other way to serve in different capacities. I have had dual membership for over 19 years. My "aha" moment came when I was traveling with then DG Tom with "Kid Sight" visiting Lions in many different Districts outside of Pa. I began to notice that women were in the clubs, therefore my "aha" moment. I realize that choosing to be both is a personal choice & choosing to take that path in no way diminishes the service & goodwill that being a Lioness puts forth. Lioness' have the ability to outshine a Lions Club at any given moment. As I said, "We are women, hear us ROAR!
