Gail provided us with an abundance of information. When asked, "how can we help", she replied by revealing to us their largest needs. As far as clothing, currently the extreme need is winter coats, any size, for any age and gender. Personal hygiene items and 1-gallon containers of laundry detergent are also in dire need. The Hub, to date, has served over 55,000 people in need, covering the entire county. They work closely with all the area food banks as well. As partners and members, we collected almost 100 pounds of canned soup to donate to the Hub! Kudos and many thanks to Lion Jeanie Sware for connecting us with Gail and the Lancaster County Food Hub and for delivering all the soup to them!

### State Council Partners in Service Update

Our State Council Partners in Service came together on Saturday, August 3, during the first Council meeting that was held in Harrisburg. In addition to PIS Lion President Bill Ross and PIS PDG Lion VP Stephen Wagner, those who volunteered to fill other positions for this Lionistic year are: Lion Linda Shipman, PIS Chaplain, Lion Cindy Kaufman, PIS Treasurer and Lion Sharon Grager, PIS Secretary. Two priority points of discussion were: (1) Partners donations that are used for service projects/expenses and (2) what service project(s) would we like to engage in.

For this new year of Partners, we agreed our main objective is to all be on the same page, to be recognized as one group. In the past, it was stated, not all Partners felt included. As we strive for inclusiveness, a motion was made to ask ALL Partner members to donate \$35.00 to the Partner account. These monies will be used for service projects and expenses incurred by the Partners group. The motion was seconded and was agreed upon by all attending.

The Service Projects discussion was based on suggestions that the project should be something we can all work on together, building inclusiveness as well as forming new friendships and supporting each other in our endeavors of service. Lion Amy Thompkins presented a project idea of Knot-Tied Fleece Blankets. A motion was made to accept this as a service project, with a second and all were in favor of The Blanket Project. When the meeting adjourned, Lion Amy made a trip to the local JoAnn Fabric Store and purchased enough fleece, at a 76% discount, to make 68 blankets.

We convened again at the second State Council meeting during the weekend of November 1<sup>st</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup>, in Wilkes-Barre. We had such a great turn-out! Seated DG partners, 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice DG partners, PDG partners and International Family partners came together to engage in our project. We even had some Seated, 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> DG's attend to help us. The first day we made approximately 40 blankets, after the second day we had a total of 72 completed. We packaged the blankets individually and presented the DG's with 4 blankets each to take back to their district, to be used to meet any needs and/or to use as examples for further service projects. Some ideas that were shared: give to nursing homes as lap blankets, children's hospitals/units, larger blankets can be made for homeless shelters, churches to give to families in need, for families in need in the clubs' community, etc. This blanket can be used as a fund-raising project as well. Set your price accordingly to the cost of the fabric and size of the blanket. Themes could be local school sports/school colors, baby, patriotic, Lionism, etc.

I do believe all participants met someone new, enjoyed the fellowship and felt a sense of accomplishment by the end of the second day. Speaking for my district, this project was presented at the 14-D cabinet meeting the following weekend. A person from each club received a raffle ticket. Four tickets were drawn, 4 lucky people had the opportunity to take a blanket back to their club to spread the word about the many possibilities this blanket project has for their community. Typed instructions were given to all as well as a list of ideas to get a club started.

Our next Partners in Service meeting will be held during the weekend of the 3<sup>rd</sup> State Council meeting, February 7<sup>th</sup> through the 9<sup>th</sup> in State College. Please join us!

This is a No Cost to Lions Clubs to do a Service Project. Just tell Veterans, Neighbors, Family members that if they have trouble reading, or understanding their prescription labels. And Script Talk RX Reader will be mailed to them, and they will tell you where participating pharmacies are. It is a loaned Rx reader to those that need it. No Cost. When done with it, just mail it back to them. No extra cost for prescriptions. They put a RFID label on the bottom of bottle, and RX reader reads the instructions to you. They can even put RFID labels on cat, or dog prescriptions bottles.

Veterans and Pharmaceutical Companies started this.

Veterans call their VIST coordinator, and they receive a permanent Script Talk RX Reader

Plus, if you tell Script Talk a Lion sent you, you will receive a free case, worth \$25.00 to carry your Script Talk Rx Reader.

## ACCESSIBLE PRESCRIPTION DRUG LABELING FACT SHEET



Accessible Prescription Labels are special labels provided by pharmacists to patients who have a visual or print impairment.

A person who requests accessible labels receives their medications with a regular printed label, called a 'legal' label, and a specialty label, called an 'auxiliary' label, which could include large print, talking and/or Braille labels, depending on the needs of the patient.

Accessible labels are provided at no additional charge.

### Large Print Labels

A label printed in high-contrast large font is attached to the prescription container.

**A 2D bar code offers access via mobile phone applications.**

### Talking Labels

A small electronic tag is attached to the container. **The tag contains the same data found on the printed label.** A prescription reader reads the label information out loud.

### Braille Labels

A clear adhesive Braille overlay is placed over the printed label for **quick identification.** **Braille labels are often used in conjunction with talking labels.**

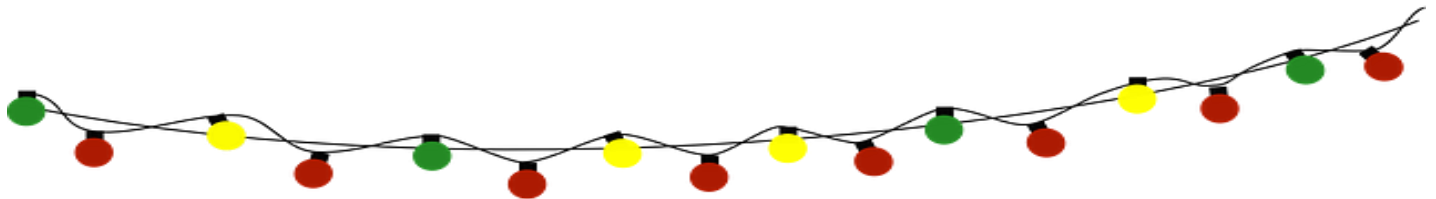

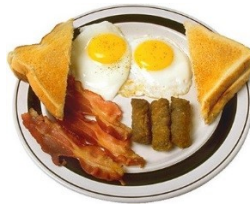
