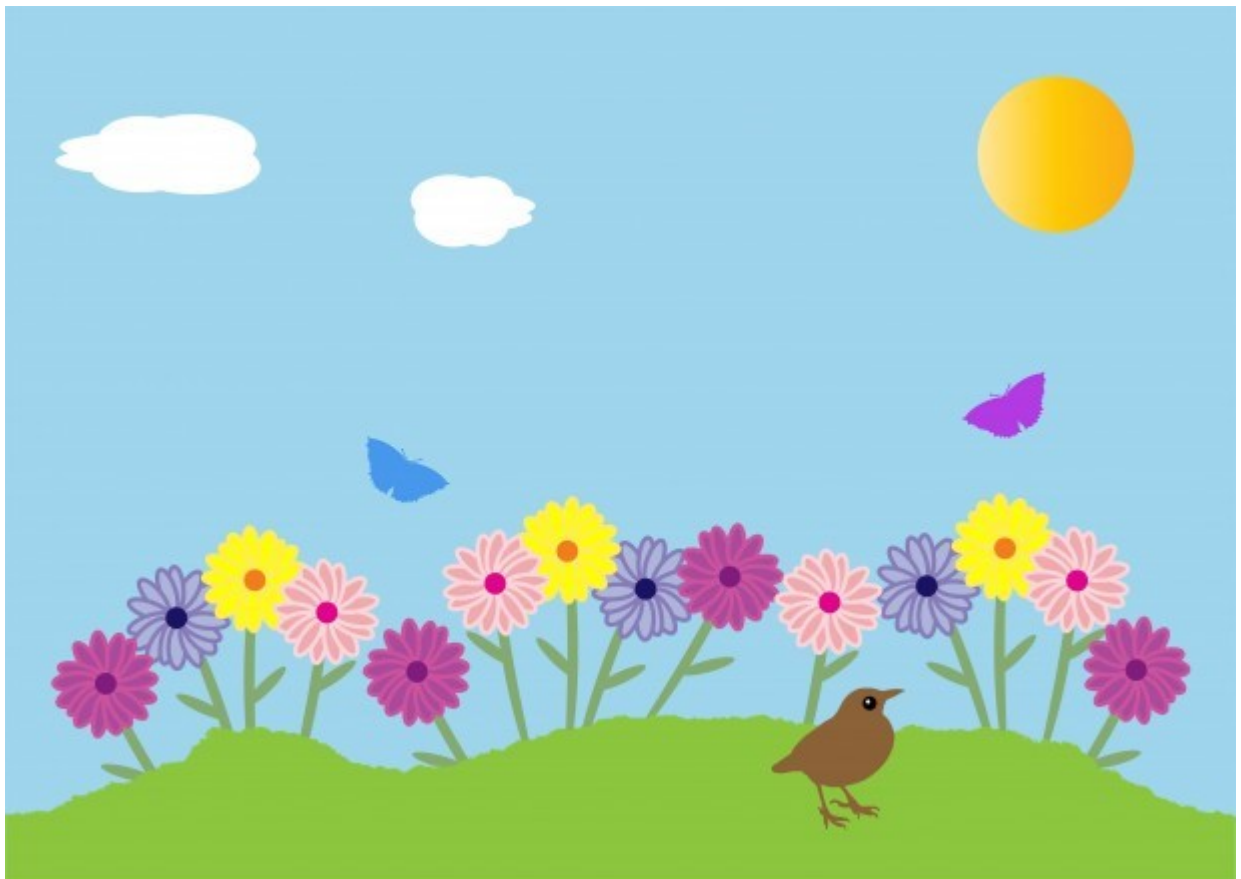

Announcement Letter from International President Choi

Dear Lion Leaders,

I am pleased to announce the appointment of Past International Director Douglas X. Alexander to the office of International First Vice President by resolution of the Lions Clubs International Board of Directors. Past International Director Alexander fills the vacancy created due to the passing of our beloved International Vice President Judge Haynes H. Townsend.

Vice President Alexander has been a member of the Brooklyn Bedford Stuyvesant Lions Club since 1984 and served as international director from 2010-2012. Professionally, he is a retired Vice President for J. P. Morgan Chase Bank. In recognition of his service to the association, he has received numerous awards including the Ambassador of Good Will Award. Vice President Alexander is a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

2020-2021 Presidential Election Procedures

The International Constitution, Article V, Section 4(k) provides that any vice president appointed to fill a vacancy shall be required to be elected, in the manner set out in this constitution and by-laws, to all successive offices. Further, any Lion who is currently serving or who has served in the office of international director will also be eligible to run for the office of International President during the 2020 International Convention in Singapore.

The Lions Clubs International Board of Directors passed a resolution requiring all current or past international directors who wish to contest for the office of International President during the 2020 International Convention in Singapore, to declare their intention to run for office in writing with the Legal Division at least sixty (60) days (April 28, 2020) prior to the convening date of the 2020 International Convention.

Please note the Board of Directors also passed a resolution in consideration of financial implications, the Presidential Theme and Board of Directors Meeting locations for the 2020-2021 fiscal year, previously chosen by the late First Vice President Judge Haynes H. Townsend, remain unchanged for the 2020-2021 fiscal year and will not be permitted to be changed by the elected International President.

Following are the Answers which I received from PDG Tom pertaining to reporting a "Donation"

Is a "Donation" a "Service Activity"?

A "Donation" is a service activity and should be entered using "My Lion" as such

If So, What Should be enter as Number of Volunteers and Hours

The number of Volunteers is the Number of Lions at the Board Meeting when the donation was approved.

The hours would be the number of Lions at the meeting times the length of the meeting. The only time that would change is if the receiving organization comes to a meeting to get the check. Then it would be the sum of both meetings.

Dear International Board of Directors,

Lions Clubs International delivers support to our clubs and members around the world so we can advance our global mission of service together. The international support and work of Lions Clubs International is fueled by the international dues of our incredible members.

In recent years, it has become increasingly clear that the services Lions Clubs International has been able to provide to members with the available budget is no longer in line with what Lions need and expect.

Our executive officers undertook an extensive review of Lions Clubs International's financials, including the implementation of substantial budget reductions. After much consideration, we are proposing to increase dues effective July 2021, by \$3, then adjusted annually for U.S. inflation. We propose using a three-year inflation average not to exceed 3.0%, but also not to be lower than 1.5%.

We realize the organization has been reluctant to adjust dues over the years. We have not adjusted international dues since 2011. The option we're proposing will help us cover our costs and allow us to suitably serve our members' needs. With that said, we do not take this issue lightly, nor are we minimizing the value of each dollar that our members contribute.

When we consider a dues adjustment, it is essential that we keep in mind that our global efforts and initiatives support more than 1.4 million members in 48,000 clubs around the world. Through the support of staff that we are able to serve globally on the level that we do, keeping members and clubs fully supported with service resources, training software and events, club operational support, international meetings, language services, technology, Foundation support, leadership support, and everything else we have come to expect as Lions.

A dues adjustment will allow Lions Clubs International to provide improved support to Lions and to continue to invest in improving programs and digital products such as our website and MyLion. It will also allow us to invest in new programs such as the Learning Management System (LMS), development of new curriculum such as digital literacy, training videos, global advertising, marketing automation, digital and video storytelling and others tools and initiatives that will enhance our impact, our brand, and our membership.

Essentially, we have to decide whether or not we want Lions Clubs International to continue to grow and thrive.

Lions is a way of life and an investment of money, time, energy and passion. As with any good investment, the more we put in, the more returns we see. I hope that you will see this proposal as we do: as an investment in the future of Lions.

Through your support, we can ensure that Lions are positioned for success in the future.

Our last 2 Lioness Clubs are still very active, serving as they have for many years, 37 years, to be exact! Ironically enough both Heidelberg & Blue Ball clubs were chartered in 1983. 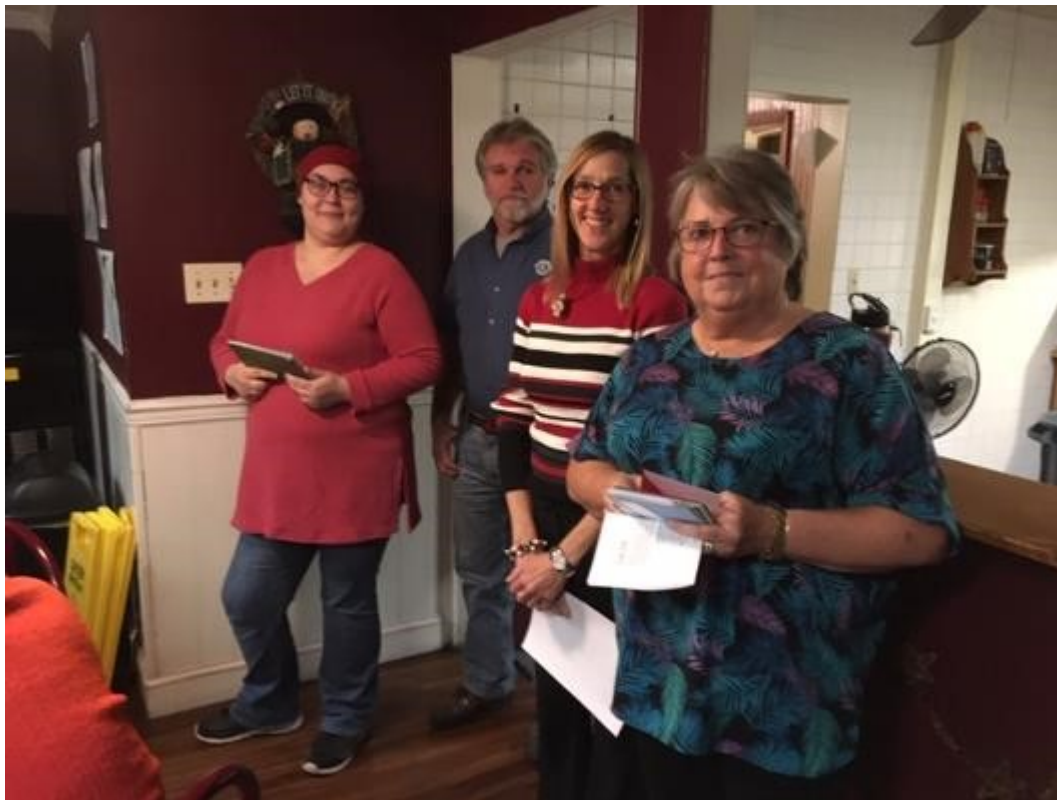

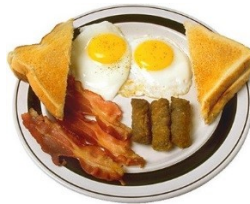
