



Palmyra Area Lions Club Aids Open Word Ministries

Over the last years, the Palmyra Area Lions Club has provided aid to Open Word Ministries(OWM), based in Mechanicsburg, PA, in preparation for their third eye clinic in Kenya this August. The club has shown support through donations of over 1500 collected eyeglasses and the purchases of a Lensometer to "read" the prescriptions on the glasses and a Trial Lens Kit to be used in the clinics.

OWM Executive Director, Sondra Spotts, has been active in ministry in Kenya since 2008. She has organized missions trips and free eye clinics, overseen the building of a children's home, and begun a child sponsorship program for 50+ Kenyan children. Presently, Open Word Ministries is overseeing the construction of a larger children's complex there, which will be home to at least 65



orphaned children. The upcoming clinic will provide free eye exams and glasses as needed to area residents of Kenya.
