Gail Rittenhouse, Executive Director of the Lancaster County Food Hub, will be our speaker. Lion Jeanie Sware has asked Gail to educate us on the outreach program of The Hub. Also, she will inform us of the needs for those who would benefit from our service. As a reminder, we are asking everyone to bring cans of soup for our Soup Drive or a monetary donation for The Hub. Thank you, Lion Jeanie, for our speaker this month and campaigning our Soup Drive to support The Hub.

Lion Evanna Estes is currently working on securing a representative from Mom's House to help us learn more about this center and how we could assist in serving this cause. We are hoping this will occur on Sunday February 16<sup>th</sup>, 2020. As soon as we have confirmation about this guest speaker, I will make sure it is included in our next newsletter.

The Partners in Service meeting held on September 22nd hosted our first guest speaker, Lion Becky Williams, District Committee Chair of the Reading Action Program (RAP) and member of the Lancaster Lions Club. Becky presented the group with a wealth of information.

- Supply new parents with books/information for young children including facts about the importance of early reading
- Collect new books for a children's hospital, local pre-schools, local urgent care waiting areas
- Sponsor a community spelling contest
- Build a little free library
- Volunteer with a literacy council
- Host a Read-In at you Lions Facility or local park, YMCA
- Work with a local school to provide back packs filled with books and school supplies for children in need
- Serve as a volunteer reader at a day care or senior center (clearance will most likely be needed)
- Provide assistive devices to children or adults who have low vision, donate magnifiers
- Provide free books for children at a vision or hearing screening or other service activity for children

VisionCorps' mission to empower individuals with vision loss to attain independence is only made possible through community support. As a member of The Willow Street Lions Club and of District 14-D, I can proudly say we have supported this foundation for many years.

This year, on November 22<sup>nd</sup>, I have volunteered to "Go Over the Edge" and rappel down 10 stories while representing my club and the district at VisionCorps' inaugural event, 2019 Eye Drop! This will happen at The Holiday Inn at the corner of Queen and Chestnut Streets in downtown Lancaster.

To do this, each "Edger" will have realized the personal goal of raising at least \$1,000 for VisionCorps to reserve a spot on the ropes. Once registered, Vision Corps provides each Edger with their own fundraising page. You can help put me Over the Edge with your donation! Last year, VisionCorps gave away \$1.5 million worth of services to individuals in South Central and Southeastern PA. Rehabilitation services provide clients the tools and training necessary to live independently in their home. VisionCorps' Enterprise Group focuses on employing people who are blind or vision impaired in manufacturing, food processing and administrative services. In addition, preventative screenings are provided to nearly 10,000 children annually!

To date I have raised \$387 on my page and \$110 in cash for a total of \$497! I am practically halfway there! The drop will occur between 9am and 4:30pm on Nov 22<sup>nd</sup>. I will not be assigned a time until I reach my goal. I will post my drop time on my page when I have it. It would be great to have all the support I can get that day.....down below.....to cheer me down Over the Edge!

Accessible Prescription Labels are special labels provided by pharmacists to patients who have a visual or print impairment.

A person who requests accessible labels receives their medications with a regular printed label, called a 'legal' label, and a specialty label, called an 'auxiliary' label, which could include large print, talking and/or Braille labels, depending on the needs of the patient.

Accessible labels are provided at no additional charge.

#### Large Print Labels

A label printed in high-contrast large font is attached to the prescription container.

A 2D bar code offers access via mobile phone applications.

#### Talking Labels

A small electronic tag is attached to the container.

#### The tag contains the same data

found on the printed label.

A prescription reader reads
the label information
out loud.

#### Braille Labels

A clear adhesive Braille overlay is placed over the printed label for quick identification.

Braille labels are often used in conjuction with talking labels.


