

Message from the 2nd Vice District Governor, Carl Spellman



As I write this message the Lions, there is a banner on the wall stating, "Where there's a need, there's a Lion". These words apply to our Club members as well as the communities we service. I know there are Lions in need now with the health situation and its restrictions, so please reach out to your District Cabinet and your Club members if you have a need.

Since in-person meetings are subject to health restrictions, the District and several Clubs are holding online meetings using Zoom software. It is a great tool and allows Lions to connect with their computers or phones. If you do not have a computer,

you can use your phone to call in and join the meeting. The District has a Zoom account and please contact PDG Deb Burkholder if you want to use Zoom. The free Zoom software can also be downloaded but you are limited to a 40-minute meeting.

On July 1, District Governor Lorraine Brown and I announced a District wide service project to send greeting cards to hospitalized veterans at the Lebanon VA Medical Center. There are 100 residents at the VA hospital, and this is a way for Lions to thank them for their service to our country. In this project, each Club sends greeting cards to an anonymous veteran, and these cards can be a friendly hello and sent on national and religious holidays. It is suggested that cards be sent monthly since there are 100 veterans at the hospital. The cards should be sent from the Club and not signed by an individual Lion. You can include this service project in your report to Lions Clubs International.

There is Now an easier and quicker way to Report your past Activities.

It consists of only one Page.

No longer do you have to go through multiple Pages.

To Use this new way to report

- Log into "MyLion" as you normally do
- Click On "Report Past Activity"
- Click on "REPORT"
- You Might Get Following Message

We have a simplified way to report. You will be directed to the new version. An option to return to the old version will be available.

Click Continue

- The One page Entry Form will be display and is self-explanatory
 - Note: If you need to enter information for one of the following and you do not see it, Just Click on "Additional Metrics
 - People Served
 - Total Volunteers
 - Total Volunteer Hours
 - Total Funds Donated
 - Organization
- Remember that Any Field with an Asterisk (*) is a Required Field
- After entering all Required Fields, two Active Buttons, "Save" and "Report", will appear
- If the "Report" button is Not Displayed, a required field was not entered
- To Report your "Past Activity" Just Click on "Report"

And That's It.

It you would still like to Report the Original Method, there is an Option at the Top, "Report the old way" which you can click on and Report your activities by using Multiple Screens

This is Only Available to Report Past Activities. To Report Future Activities you still need to use the Multiple Screens Method

HOW TO JOIN A ZOOM MEETING

To Join a Zoom meeting, a host first has to create a meeting and share the invite URL, smart phone one-tap number, or Telephone dialing number and the meeting ID number and password. You do not need a Zoom login to join a meeting and it is not necessary to download the Zoom application to join a meeting from your web browser. However, some Zoom features, such as sharing your screen, will not be available without the Zoom application software.

** Zoom will require passwords to enter calls and will switch on waiting rooms by default starting on April 5th. Zoom hosts will have to approve attendees before they can participate in a call, unless the host disables the new security features.

Optional

Before joining a Zoom meeting on a computer or mobile device, you can download the Zoom app from their <u>Download Center</u>. Otherwise, you will be prompted to download and install Zoom when you click a join link. If you're looking to use Zoom for the first time, make sure you're downloading it directly from zoom.us.

You can also join a test meeting to familiarize yourself with Zoom. If you've already downloaded Zoom to your device, there's no need to visit a Zoom website to use the video conferencing platform.

Prerequisites

- Each meeting has a unique 9, 10, or 11-digit number called a meeting ID that will be required to join a Zoom meeting
- If you are joining via telephone, you will need the teleconferencing number provided in the invite.
- Each meeting also requires a passcode/password, included in your invite.

TELEPHONE

- On your phone, dial the teleconferencing number provided in your invite.
- 2. Enter the meeting ID number when prompted using your dial pad, and then the password when asked. There is no video this way—it's only what you hear or say. Other participants don't see you; you don't see them.
- ** You can join a Zoom meeting via teleconferencing/audio conferencing using a traditional landline phone. This is useful when you do not have a microphone or speaker on your PC/Mac, or you do not have a smartphone.

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION CONCERNS AMENDING THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF LIONS CLUBS MULTIPLE DISTRICT-14 (PENNSYLVANIA) CONSTITUTION. TO BE ADOPTED, THIS AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION REQUIRES AN AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF TWO-THIRDS (2/3) OF THE CERTIFIED DELEGATES CASTING A VOTE.

THE RESOLUTION ADDS LANGUAGE TO CLARIFY: 1) THE TERM OF OFFICE FOR THE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON; 2) THE SELECTION PROCESS FOR APPOINTING A REPLACEMENT IN THE EVENT OF A VACANCY IN THE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON POSITION; AND 3) THE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON ROTATION.

BE IT RESOLVED, that effective July 1, 2021, Article VII, Section 4, will read as follows:

*Section 4: COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON. The Chairperson of the State Council shall be the Immediate Past District Governor who had served in the capacity of Vice-Chairperson during the preceding year, who for the year 2020-2021 shall be from Sub-District P. The Council Chairperson shall serve for a one-year term only and cannot serve in that capacity again.

In the event, either before or after becoming the Chairperson, if unable or refuses to serve, or having accepted, resigns or dies, then the District Governor of that sub-district shall appoint a Past-District Governor who is resident in and a member in good standing of a Lions Club in that sub-district to serve out the term of office. If no Past District Governor from the sub-district is willing to serve, then the sitting Council of Governors will appoint a Past District Governor from the two preceding State Councils who is a resident in and member in good standing of a Lions Club in Pennsylvania to serve the remaining term of office. The normal Council Chairperson rotation will resume when the replacement Council Chairperson's term of office is completed.

- REPLACES THE "PENNSYLVANIA NEWS PUBLICATION FUND" WITH THE "COMMUNICATION/WEB/PRIDE FUND" AND REDUCES THE ALLOCATION FROM \$1.50 TO \$0.25
