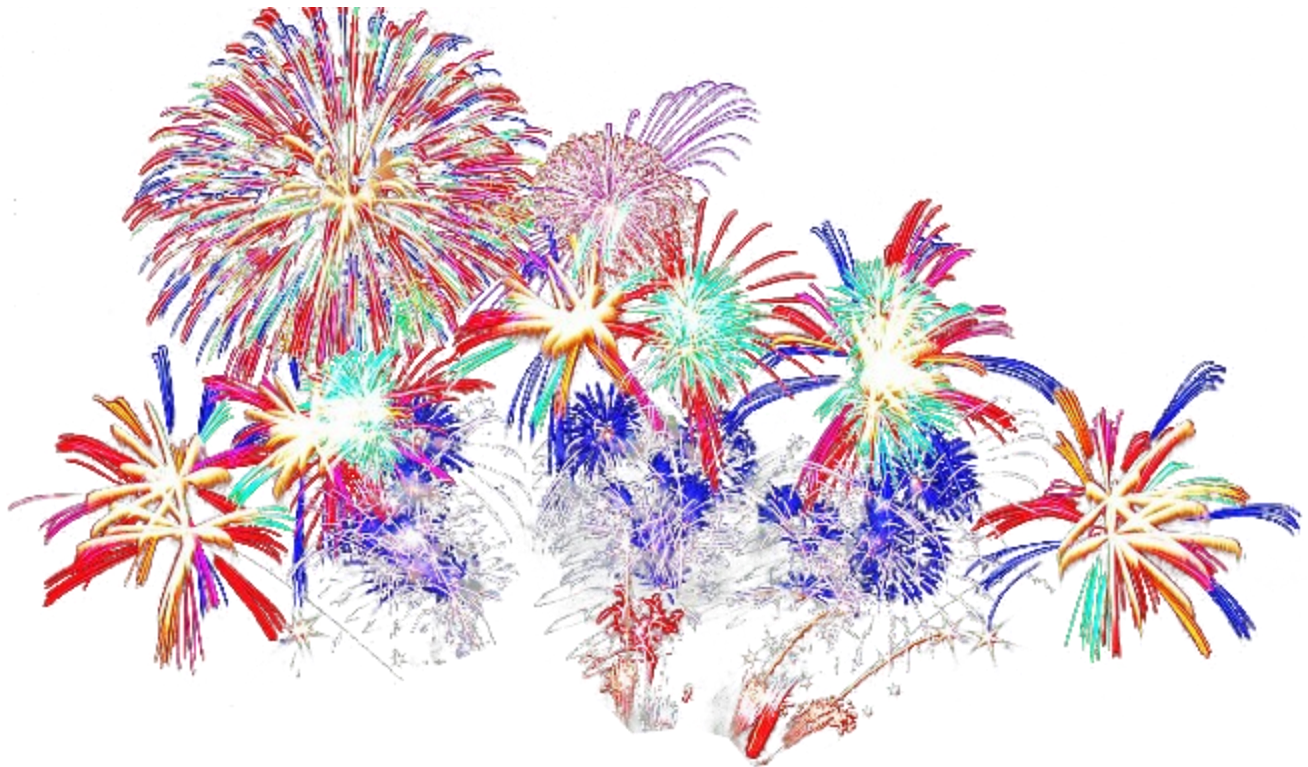

There is Now an easier and quicker way to Report your past Activities.

It consists of only one Page.

No longer do you have to go through multiple Pages.

To Use this new way to report

- Log into "MyLion" as you normally do
- Click On "Report Past Activity"
- Click on "REPORT"
- You Might Get Following Message

Great News!

We have a simplified way to report. You will be directed to the new version. An option to return to the old version will be available.

Click Continue

- The One page Entry Form will be display and is self-explanatory
 - Note: If you need to enter information for one of the following and you do not see it, Just Click on "Additional Metrics"
 - People Served
 - Total Volunteers
 - Total Volunteer Hours
 - Total Funds Donated
 - Organization
- Remember that Any Field with an Asterisk (*) is a Required Field
- After entering all Required Fields, two Active Buttons, "Save" and "Report", will appear
- If the "Report" button is Not Displayed, a required field was not entered
- To Report your "Past Activity" Just Click on "Report"

And That's It.

If you would still like to Report the Original Method, there is an Option at the Top, "Report the old way" which you can click on and Report your activities by using Multiple Screens

This is Only Available to Report Past Activities. To Report Future Activities you still need to use the Multiple Screens Method

HOW TO JOIN A ZOOM MEETING

To join a Zoom meeting, a host first has to create a meeting and share the invite URL, smart phone one-tap number, or Telephone dialing number and the meeting ID number and password. You do not need a Zoom login to join a meeting and it is not necessary to download the Zoom application to join a meeting from your web browser. However, some Zoom features, such as sharing your screen, will not be available without the Zoom application software.

**** Zoom will require passwords to enter calls and will switch on waiting rooms by default starting on April 5th. Zoom hosts will have to approve attendees before they can participate in a call, unless the host disables the new security features.**

Optional

Before joining a Zoom meeting on a computer or mobile device, you can download the Zoom app from their [Download Center](#). Otherwise, you will be prompted to download and install Zoom when you click a join link. If you're looking to use Zoom for the first time, make sure you're downloading it directly from [zoom.us](#).

You can also [join a test meeting](#) to familiarize yourself with Zoom. If you've already downloaded Zoom to your device, there's no need to visit a Zoom website to use the video conferencing platform.

Prerequisites

- Each meeting has a unique 9, 10, or 11-digit number called a meeting ID that will be required to join a Zoom meeting
- If you are joining via telephone, you will need the teleconferencing number provided in the invite.
- Each meeting also requires a passcode/password, included in your invite.

****For security reasons by Zoom default, you will be placed into a waiting room until the host starts the meeting. Individual Hosts can adjust this new requirement.**

TELEPHONE

1. On your phone, dial the teleconferencing number provided in your invite.
2. Enter the meeting ID number when prompted using your dial pad, and then the password when asked.

There is no video this way—it's only what you hear or say. Other participants don't see you; you don't see them.

**** You can join a Zoom meeting via teleconferencing/audio conferencing using a traditional landline phone.** This is useful when you do not have a microphone or speaker on your PC/Mac, or you do not have a smartphone.

Ballot Question 1

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION CONCERNS AMENDING THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF LIONS CLUBS MULTIPLE DISTRICT-14 (PENNSYLVANIA) CONSTITUTION. TO BE ADOPTED, THIS AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION REQUIRES AN AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF TWO-THIRDS (2/3) OF THE CERTIFIED DELEGATES CASTING A VOTE.

A RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE TO ARTICLE VII, SECTION 4, COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON.

THE RESOLUTION ADDS LANGUAGE TO CLARIFY : 1) THE TERM OF OFFICE FOR THE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON; 2) THE SELECTION PROCESS FOR APPOINTING A REPLACEMENT IN THE EVENT OF A VACANCY IN THE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON POSITION; AND 3) THE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON ROTATION.

BE IT RESOLVED, that effective July 1, 2021, Article VII, Section 4, will read as follows:

*Section 4: COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON. The Chairperson of the State Council shall be the Immediate Past District Governor who had served in the capacity of Vice-Chairperson during the preceding year, who for the year 2020-2021 shall be from Sub-District P. The Council Chairperson shall serve for a one-year term only and cannot serve in that capacity again.

In the event, either before or after becoming the Chairperson, if unable or refuses to serve, or having accepted, resigns or dies, then the District Governor of that sub-district shall appoint a Past-District Governor who is resident in and a member in good standing of a Lions Club in that sub-district to serve out the term of office. If no Past District Governor from the sub-district is willing to serve, then the sitting Council of Governors will appoint a Past District Governor from the two preceding State Councils who is a resident in and member in good standing of a Lions Club in Pennsylvania to serve the remaining term of office. The normal Council Chairperson rotation will resume when the replacement Council Chairperson's term of office is completed.

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION CONCERNS AMENDING THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF LIONS CLUBS MULTIPLE DISTRICT-14 (PENNSYLVANIA) BY-LAWS. TO BE ADOPTED, THIS AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS REQUIRES AN AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF THE MAJORITY OF THE CERTIFIED DELEGATES CASTING A VOTE.

- INCREASES THE "SUB-DISTRICT ADMINISTRATIVE FUND" FROM \$2.50 TO \$3.00
- REPLACES THE "PENNSYLVANIA NEWS PUBLICATION FUND" WITH THE "COMMUNICATION/WEB/PRIDE FUND" AND REDUCES THE ALLOCATION FROM \$1.50 TO \$0.25

I am excited to share the news with our clubs in 14D that we have been approved to implement as ADA Committee position. Now, you may be asking yourself, “Why do we need an ADA Chairperson – we’ve been serving the community just fine for 40, 50, 60 or even 70+ years”? Well, one reason is so our clubs will understand how to better serve **all** folks in our communities.

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) became law in 1990. The ADA is a civil rights law that prohibits discrimination against individuals with disabilities in all areas of public life. The purpose of the law is to make sure that people with disabilities have the same rights and opportunities as everyone else. The ADA gives civil rights protections to individuals with disabilities similar to those provided to individuals on the basis of race, color, sex, national

origin, age, and religion. It guarantees equal opportunity for individuals with disabilities in communications, educational facilities, employment, public accommodation, state and local government services, telecommunications and transportation. The ADA is divided into five titles (or sections) that relate to different areas of public life.

Sir Thomas Browne was the first to put the expression “charity begins at home” into print in the form we now use, in *Religio Medici*, 1642. Let’s apply this valuable quote and the ADA to our clubs.

Is your club location physically accessible to all members?

Is there at least one no-step entry?

Is there an accessible toilet facility with grab bars in at least one toilet stall?

Are all club members able to hear and understand speakers and each other during discussions?

Are materials provided in large print if requested by a member with vision loss?

Our clubs should be looking at the same above bullet points when we provide services in our communities. The ADA will not come apply in all our activities but at times it may. As We Serve in our communities we should strive to ensure the product[s]/results of our efforts are accessible to all people.

If you are interested in learning more about this important civil rights law [which turns 30 years old on July 26th] please reach out to me.
