The members of the Northeast PA Lions Service Foundation held their semi-annual retreat on January 8th at the Lions Clubs Pa State Council in Harrisburg. The meeting is important because operations from the previous year are reviewed and plans are developed for the coming year.

The NEPALSF annually supports **Salus University** with student scholarships for students of our coverage area. This year's **grant is \$45,000.00** for a pilot program which offers stipends to students eligible for clinical courses (i.e., internship) so they can devote a full semester to the provision of services (under Salus supervision) at agencies/field placements in the central and northeast sections of PA. A little more information on this program will be in the NEPALSF submission in the next "Pride" publication.

We have updated our Mission and Vision Statements to more closely reflect what we do.

To assist Lions and Leo Clubs in their service goals by providing grant funding for community service projects, education, equipment & patient care. To see all of our Lions and Leo Clubs serve, support and benefit their communities with the resources of our Northeast PA Lions Service Foundation.



PENNSYLVANIA PIN TRADERS PIN SWAP 2022


