The Lions of PA came together and filled 2 tractor trailers with the material needed for the recovery in Kentucky. Originally, State Disaster Relief Coordinator Jim Groff arranged for 1 tractor trailer. When Lion Jim heard that the tractor trailer would be filled after being loaded at Lowes' in Morgantown and at the State Office in Harrisburg he quickly arranged for another tractor trailer to go to Cranberry Township in Western PA. The Lions in Western PA filled the second tractor trailer. Kudos to Lion Ed Baylor who led the effort to fill the tractor trailers and send all those items to Kentucky.

The State Council of Governors approved paying for a motor coach to take many PA Lions to Kentucky to unload the tractor trailers, distribute the needed materials to families in Kentucky, and to work helping with the cleanup effort. Thank you to 14-C FVDG Keith Shoff for arranging a steep discount for the motor coach. Thank you to all the PA Lions who travelled to Kentucky.

#### Message from the 2nd Vice District Governor, Mike Schaeffer

#### **KENTUCKY ADVENTURE TO HELP TORNADO VICTIMS**

On Sunday, January 23, 2022, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice District Governor Mike Schaeffer boarded a bus headed for Paducah, Kentucky, to deliver disaster relief equipment, supplies and clothing to help with clean-up efforts in towns devastated by tornadoes in December. The following is an account of how the trip got organized and what happened during their trip.

December 10-11 - The country begins to receive word of deadly tornados in western Kentucky. News reports show severe damage to significant portions of multiple towns, including Mayfield, Dawson Springs, Benton, and Bremen.

December 21 - District Governor Dick Sware receives a letter from PA Lions Disaster Relief Coordinator Lion Jim Groff asking DG Dick to alert the Lions Clubs in District 14-D of the need for relief supplies for victims of the tornadoes. DG Dick forwards the request to members of the District Cabinet, and clubs begin organizing their response to the PA Lions request for donations.

January 7-9 – While attending VDG training in Harrisburg, I learn of the opportunity to travel to Kentucky to assist in the delivery of supplies. With the assistance of 14-C 1<sup>st</sup> VDG, Keith Shoff, we arrange for a Bailey Motor Coach to transport the group of Lions traveling to Kentucky.

January 12 - Past International Director Cindy Gregg circulates details to potential volunteers regarding plans for the Disaster Relief Team traveling to Kentucky.



January 18 – Assistant Disaster Relief Coordinator, Ed Baylor, and I purchase supplies at Morgantown Lowe's. In addition to Lion Ed's first trip, and the overwhelming generosity of Lowe's management, we purchased nearly \$15,000 in retail merchandise.

January 19 – I purchased an additional \$1200 in supplies at Weaver's Hardware Store, Leola. Funds collected by District 14-D clubs were used for these supplies.

January 21 – DG Dick, Lion Ed Baylor, and I are part of a group of approximately 25 Lions who help load our PA Lions trailer with supplies at the Morgantown Lowe's and PA Lions State Office. When the trailer arrives in Harrisburg, it is already half filled with equipment and supplies loaded in Morgantown earlier in the day. It quickly becomes apparent that the donations stored in Harrisburg will fill the trailer, and another trailer will be needed to for the equipment and supplies to be picked up in Cranberry, PA. Within an hour, Lion Jim Groff has arrangements in place for a second trailer.

January 23 – I board a Bailey's Motor Coach at 6:00am at the Lancaster County Public Safety Center. I was joined by other Lions who met earlier at the company's bus barn near Spring Grove. The bus then goes to Belle Vernon to pick up the remaining 5 Lions who will ride the bus to Kentucky. At 8:30 p.m. Central Time, the bus rolls into the parking lot of Broadway United Methodist Church in Paducah, Kentucky, which will be the groups home for the next 6 nights.

January 24 - The group, after a good night's rest, is on the road by 9:00 a.m. traveling to a home near



Mayfield, Kentucky, to help clean up debris around the property. Two additional Lions who have driven themselves to Kentucky join the group. As the bus nears the property, the group catches its first glimpses of debris scattered by the tornado. The path of the storm quickly becomes obvious, and the damage to the landscape and properties is chilling. After finding our assigned property and organizing the group, we begin the clean-up process, which involves multiple Lions using chainsaws to cut up damaged and downed trees, clearing and stacking limbs and logs, and picking up trash.

Following the clean-up, PDG Bill Metschulat from District 14-H, takes the group on a tour of downtown Mayfield. PDG Bill has been in Mayfield working for Mennonite Relief Services for the past two weeks assessing property damage. The damage we see as

we drive through the streets of the town is unbelievable and nearly indescribable. A significant portion of the properties, well over 50%, are either damaged or destroyed in the storm. Homes, churches, and businesses are reduced to rubble. Large piles of twisted steel, metal roofing, cinder blocks and bricks line block after block of the town.



We stop at one property where the house was destroyed, and the lot has been completely cleared. The family living in the house consisted of a husband, wife, and their daughter. As the storm approached, the husband sent his wife and

daughter to an interior bathroom on the first floor (the home had no basement). Curious to watch the storm, the husband stayed on the second floor.

When the house began to shudder, he headed to the first floor, but the house had already shifted, and he couldn't get into the bathroom. He grabbed a table and put it over himself as the storm hit the house. When the storm passed the family emerged from their shelter to find the entire second floor of the house gone. Fortunately, they were not injured.

Across the street, a husband and wife were keeping their 18-month-old granddaughter. They were fortunate to have a basement and took shelter there to ride out the storm. Following the storm, they came out of the basement to find significant damage to their home. Miraculously, the 18-month-old slept through the entire ordeal!



January 25 - The team is up early today and leaves the church at 7:45 for a short drive to the Paducah



Lions Club Storage building where we will unload the trailers filled with relief equipment, supplies and clothing. After a quick assessment of the storage facility, it becomes clear that two trailers full of supplies will not fit. Arrangements are quickly made to unload the second trailer at a nearby disaster relief distribution center. On hand to greet the PA Lions trailer as it arrives are Lions Clubs International President Douglas Alexander and International Director Shea Nickell. Later that evening, we are honored to have dinner with IP Alexander and ID Nickel



January 26 & 27 - Each of these two days we travel to Princeton, Kentucky. The team is split into two groups. One group works at H.R. Ministries, a relief distribution center, and other group works at a debris clean-up site. The team members working the distribution center spend their time sorting and organizing donations. Qualifying individuals come to this center to pick up food and supplies. The Lions who work at this center hear heart-breaking stories of individuals dis-

placed by the tornado.

The team members cleaning up debris brave temperatures in the 20's and clear debris from a wooded area several hundred yards from what used to be the University of Kentucky Research and Education Center. This center, which was less than two years old, took a direct hit and was destroyed, despite being designed to withstand a tornado. The

and was destroyed, despite being designed to withstand a tornado. The debris from this facility, along with that from two houses across the road, is scattered hundreds of yards up a wooded hillside. Our team

works to clear damaged and downed trees, separate pieces of twisted metal roofing and framing form other debris and bag all types of litter

from the affected area. It takes our team of nine Lions two days to clear and area approximately 75 yards by 50 yards.





At the end of the second day, we take a detour on the way home to view the damage in Dawson Springs, Kentucky. Three days earlier, we met Shawn and Elaine from the Madisonville Lions Club, one of the clubs in the Dawson Springs area. These two Lions helped unload our trailers. One of them ran the fork-lift and the other developed and coordinated the organization plan for the storage facility. We sent generators, kerosene heaters, chainsaws, and other items with them. Within a few hours, were received word that one of the generators had already been delivered to a family in need.







January 29 - We have the bus packed and are on the road by 7:00 a.m. Central Time. It's a long ride home, but there are wonderful discussions regarding ways to enhance our PA Lions Disaster Relief efforts. Again, we laugh, and we cry as we remember and retell stories from the past week. After nine hours, we arrive in Belle Vernon and say our goodbyes to five of our team members. Several hours later, we pull into the training center in Lancaster, and we are dropped off. Finally, at 11:00 p.m., the bus pulls into the bus depot near Spring Grove where VDG Keith and PDG Dennis (14-C) get off the bus, load their vehicles, and head home.

DG Dick and the entire leadership team of 14-D couldn't be prouder of our clubs for their response to the call for donations of equipment, supplies and Lowe's gift cards to support this relief effort. We are extremely grateful for your generosity, and we want you to rest assured that your donations are in good hands and going to folks who are in desperate need of necessities. I can attest to the extreme level of need and tremendous outpouring of appreciation the team received from International President Alexander, International Director Nickell, and especially the victims of these devastating tornadoes. It was a true testament to, "Service from the heart".



#### LIONS OF PENNSYLVANIA FOUNDATION

A ZOOM meeting was held with the Board on January 15, 2022. 15 Board members attended along with 2 LOPF members.

The treasurer's report showed we had as of 1/15 \$202,327.42 in the Grant Fund. We will be adding to that amount on July 1, 2022.

The investment report shows we did have a slight decrease in the investments of 5.52%. We now show a balance of \$2,853,403 in our Fellowship Funds. In the Liability Funds, there is a balance of \$671,525, a decrease of 3.15%.

Four Grant Requests were discussed. 3 were approved and 1 went back tabled until the next meeting. Those approved were:

State Council request for \$5,000 for Multiple Districts for Billboard advertising. The was approved with a cap of \$5,000, which is \$500 per District and must be requested with a Grant Request form.

Request from Bern Township Lions Club in District 14-P for \$40,000 for a Splash Pool. This was approved.

Request from Kempton Lions Club in 14-P for \$40,000 for the creation of a pavilion on Leaser Lake. This was approved.

A request from the Lakemont Lions Club in 14-L, which had been tabled, was again tabled until additional information on their roof replacement is received.

Total Grant payments will be \$80,000 leaving a balance in the Grant Fund of \$122,327.40.

Our Website (lions of pa foundation.org) is doing well and is updated on a regular basis. All forms can be found on the site and downloaded.


