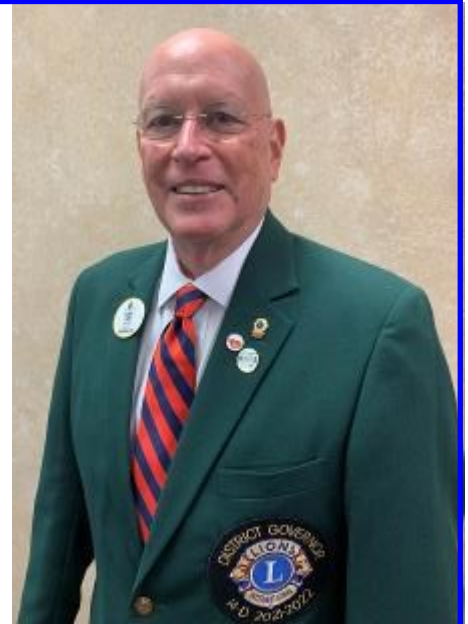


District 14 D- Details

A Message from District Governor Dick Sware

Highlights from the State Council Meeting include: Our own PDG Deb Burkholder was approved as the new Chair of the State Finance Committee. Congrats PDG Deb; I know that you'll do a fantastic job in that important position. Our own Disaster Relief Coordinator, Lion Jim Groff received both a Presidential Medal and the Ambassador of Goodwill from International Director Larry Edwards on behalf of Immediate Past President Choi. The Presidential Medal is the second highest award the International President gives. The Ambassador of Goodwill is the highest award given by the International President. There are only 40 Ambassadors given each year. Both are so well deserved. As Past International Director LeGrand Perce said, There's no one that embodies an Ambassador of Goodwill more than Lion Jim Groff. Please see the pictures of those awards in later in the newsletter. We had the culmination of the Shave the Stache LCIF fundraiser. If you haven't heard of this, International Director Larry Edwards & Past International Director Jim Cavallero promised to shave their mustaches if we raised \$10000 or more for LCIF's Campaign 100. Combines, ID Larry & PID Jim have had their mustaches for more than 100 years. We raised \$11,700. 12 Melvin Jones Fellowships were given from a drawing of those who contributed and the mustaches were shaved. Last & certainly not least, the on the recommendation of the LCI Board of Directors as presented by ID Larry Edwards, the State Council approved endorsing Past International Director A P Singh for the position of International Third Vice President. PID Singh will be on the ballot for election at the 2022 International Convention to be held in Montreal, Canada.



We had a very nice attendance at our first District Cabinet Meeting. There's room for many more. We have a big room available at the Willow Street Lions Community Building. Come out to participate in your District. It's a great way to promote what your club is doing and hear what others are doing. 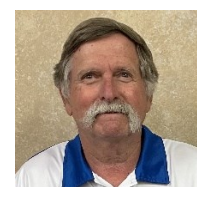

LIONS OF PA FOUNDATION

August 7, 2021

LOPF held a Board meeting on Saturday, July 24, 2021 in Harrisburg. There were a total of 18 in attendance, including 14 Board members. New member IPDG Dan Lombardo was introduced. Our second new member, PDG Fran Stepkovitch, was unable to attend.

We received a letter from State Administrator, Lion Bob McComas, asking the Foundation if they would again be the sponsor for PA Counsellors/District Governors Honors Banquet at the 2022 MD-14 State Convention on May 20, 2022 at a donation amount of \$1,000. The Board voted approval and we will again sponsor the event.

The report from our treasurer indicated that at the end of June 2021 we still had \$129,112 available for Grants. By adding, as of July 1, 2021, another \$125,000, we start the Lions year with \$254,000 in the account for Grants.

The report from our investment counselor shows that we currently have invested \$3,056,563 plus another \$587,407 in our Liability Funds (investment money from Districts and Clubs). Our return on investment from June 30, 2020 to June 30, 2021 was 57.41% with the amount being \$1,114,773.

There were 8 Grant requests presented at the meeting. The first one discussed was:

- A. District 14-C and the Lions Clubs of Adams County asking for \$10,000 for increasing storage space for the Adams County Gleaning Project. Since they requesting a similar amount from LCIF, we will hold payment until LCIF grant is approved.
- B. District 14-K and the Richmond Lions Club requested \$6,000 for recreational field renovation. Board approved grant of \$5,600.
- C. District 14-L and the Cove Lions Club requested \$4,825 for renovation of the community building. This was approved.
- D. District 14-P and the Honey Brook Lions Club requested \$2,000 for the Food Pantry. This was approved.
- E. District 14-N and the Chippewa Area Lions Club requested \$1,300 for purchases of benches for the community. This was approved.
- F. District 14-G and the north Central Sight Services requested \$26,833 for the purchase of a 2021 Dodge Ram Truck. Board approved \$10,000 under LOPF policy.
- G. District 14-A and the Bensalem Lions Club requested \$1,750 for purchase of a new freezer for the Cornwells United Methodist Food Pantry. This was approved.
- H. District 14-L and the Lakemont Lions Club requested \$8,075 for ArtsAltoona, an after school program. This was approved.

A report on the Fellowship Program indicates we now have 2,270 Fellows.

Our annual banquet will be held on Friday, October 29th at the Valley Forge Casino Resort in King of Prussia. All 1st Vice District Governors and their partners will be our guests.

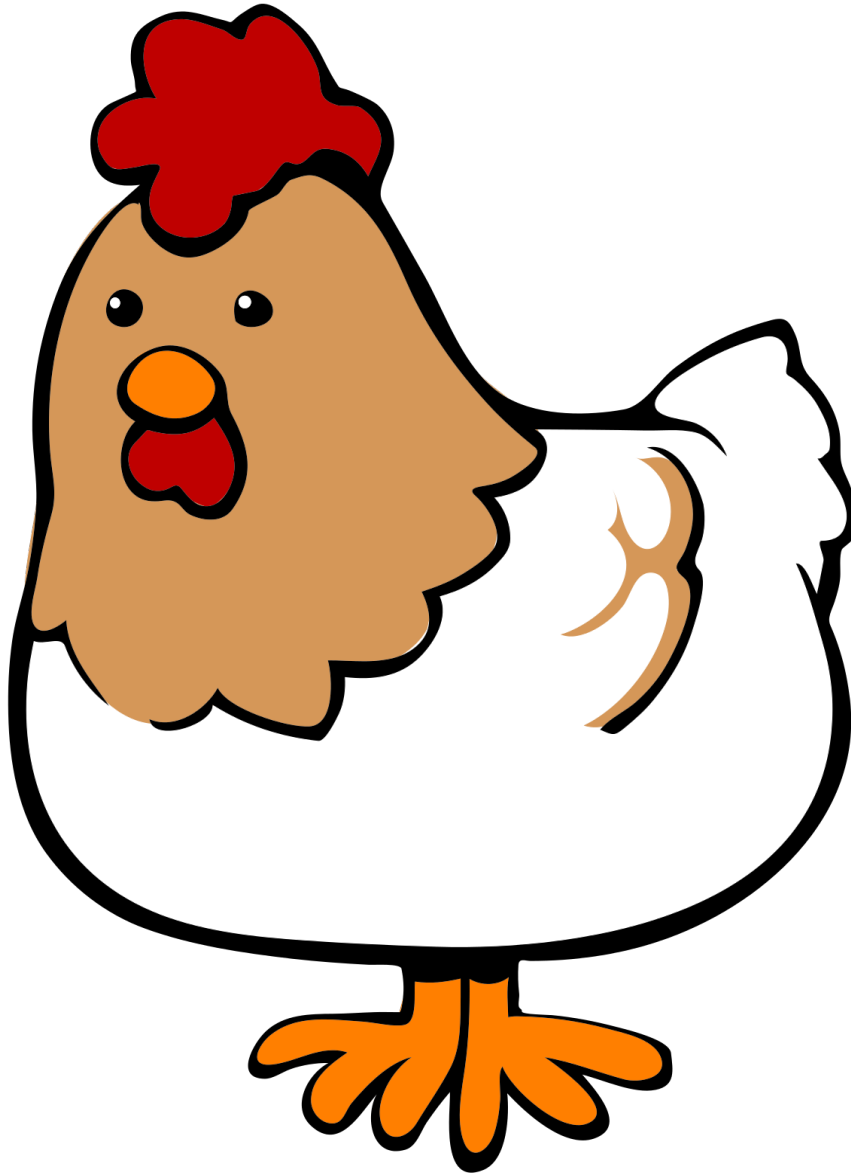

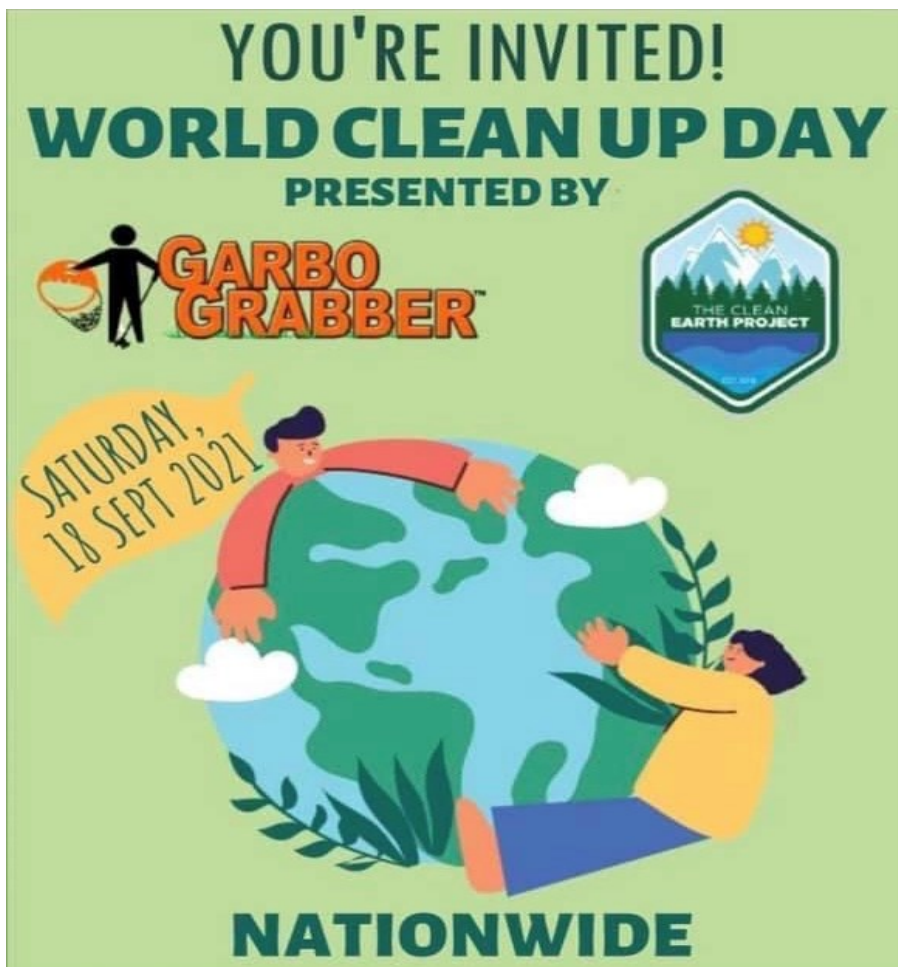
