Social Media Safety Tips

To help you maintain a certain level of **privacy** on social media sites, here are some tips:

- Please read Terms and Conditions carefully. It is a bit difficult and time-consuming task, but at least have a look.
- Go through privacy settings in your account. Don't rely on default settings.
- Stop clicking on useless posts like "Check your death day", "Find which celebrity do you look like" and so on.
- Install a good antivirus software in your computer and phone.
- Turn off your location. Some sites even keep track of your activities in the offline world, but turning off location will at least do the least possible loss.
- Do not forget to set up Security Answers.
- Never leave your account logged in. You are in a way inviting cyber criminals to hack your account or act as an impostor.
- Always check and analyze your post before posting. Try not to put too much revealing photos online.
- Always try to create a strong password for a site and try to change it in regular intervals of time. Never ever set same passwords for multiple sites.

The 2023 District 14-D Convention is rapidly approaching. The date of the convention is April 15, 2023, and will be held at the Lancaster County Career and Technology Center, **432 Old Market Street, Mount Joy, PA 17552**

As always, there is a cost to the district to sponsor an event such as this. To help offset this cost, we again are asking all the clubs in District 14-D to put together a "Theme" basket and donate it to the convention.

For those clubs who might not be familiar with this fundraiser, this is how it works: An assortment of items with a common "Theme" are placed in a basket and covered with clear wrapping. Strips of tickets are then sold to everyone attending President's Honor Night and the District Convention. They place their tickets in containers that are in front of each basket. A ticket is then pulled the day of the Convention from each container and whoever has the winning ticket gets to take that "Theme" basket home.

Some common "Themes" of previous baskets were Gardening, Lottery Tickets, Food, Golf, Money, and even a Chocolate or Bologna themed or plants with money growing out of them. These items do not necessarily have to be placed in a basket and may consist of one larger item only such as a small grill, crock pot, small television etc. You can even put a \$50 bill in a frame as an item for the fundraiser. **Baskets that are filled with items that are produced locally are always a big hit.** Each basket should be worth around \$50.00. **ALCOHOL IN BASKETS IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED but you can put in a gift card for alcohol.**

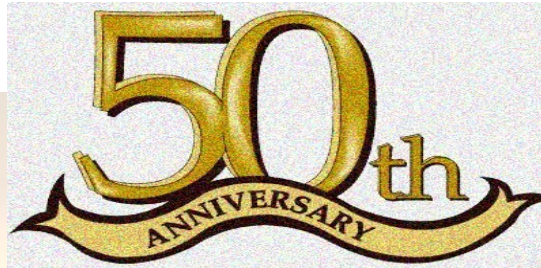

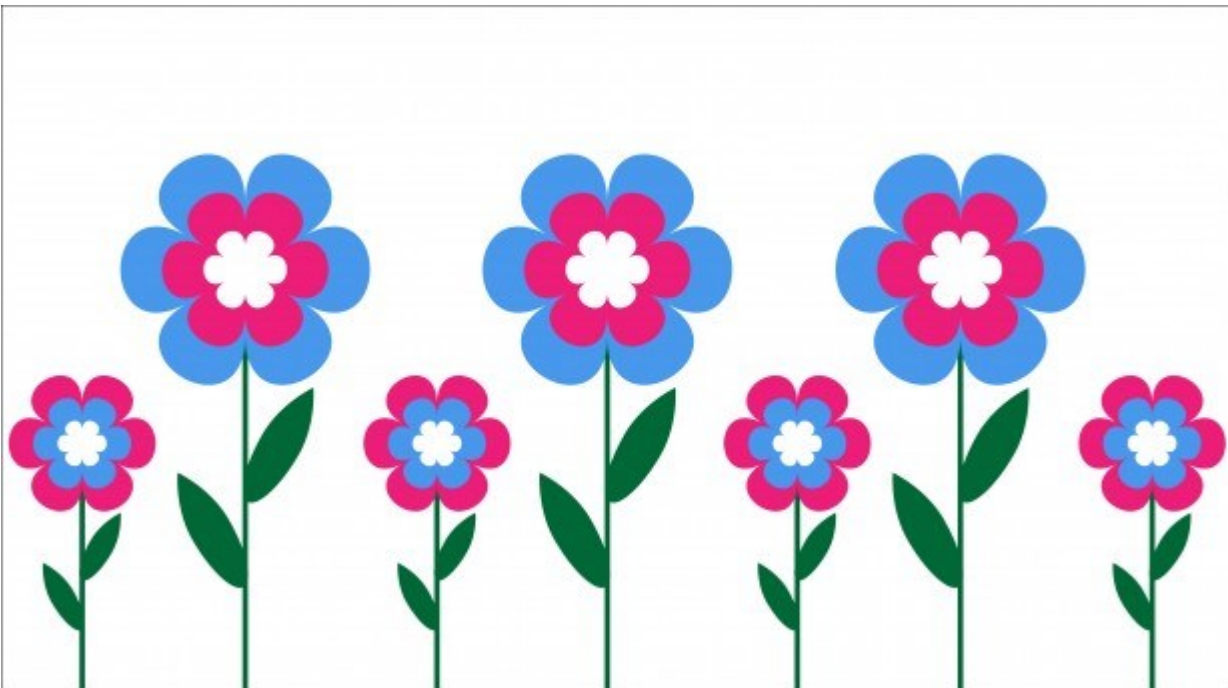
