"It's easy to stay safe online."

Sometimes it's scary to be online. You don't know who is out there, tracking you and trying to steal your identity. Following is the fourth easy action item to help you protect yourself from identity theft.

Spot and report phishing scams

Learning to recognize and report phishing scams is a top step you can take to stay safe online. Fortunately, it's fairly easy to do and doesn't take long at all.

What is a phishing scam? It's when a cybercriminal sends you a fake email, direct message, text, or even a pop-up ad to try to trick you into taking an action such as clicking a link, providing personal information, or making a payment. A phishing message may be cleverly disguised to look like a real message from a familiar company such as your bank.

Cybercriminals can be pretty sophisticated with phishing scams, to the point that there are many types of phishing techniques that have earned their own names. For example, "spear phishing" targets a specific individual rather than a group, and "whaling" targets a big fish like the CEO of a company.

Learning to spot the telltale signs of phishing and to stop and think before taking action on an email or other message can go a long way towards keeping you safe from phishing scams. Here are some clues that can tip you off to a phishing attack:

- Attachments that look odd
- Grammar errors or misspellings
- Offers for free gadgets, trips, or other items of value
- Language that sounds just a little bit "off"

If you receive a suspected phishing message: Don't click on links or open attachments, report phishing to your email provider, delete the message and block the sender.

The Ephrata Lions Club is sponsoring its 43rd annual Sports Card Show and Auction on Saturday, March 25, 2023, between 8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. at the Ephrata Recreation Center. The Rec Center is located at 130 South Academy Drive, Ephrata, PA, near the intersection of US 322 and PA 272. Overflow parking is available at the Ephrata Middle School.

The sports card show features over seventy (70) vendor tables, where attendees may buy, sell, and trade baseball cards and other sports-related items. (All available vendor tables are currently sold for 2022.) Admission to the show is \$5.00 for adults, \$1.00 for children under twelve (12).

Autograph tickets are \$25 each for one (1) autograph on a "flat" (e.g., a card, photo, or magazine) or on a mini-helmet; or \$35 each on all other items (e.g., balls, helmets, equipment, apparel, posters, or pennants). All autographs may include only one (1) inscription. Only three hundred (300) autograph tickets will be sold, and are only available to purchase in person on the day of the show. Ticket sales will stop at 12:30, and all ticket buyers must be in line by 12:45. No mail orders will be accepted, and there are no advanced ticket sales. Ticket buyers may bring their own items to be autographed, or items may be purchased from the Ephrata Lions Club or from other vendors.

A live sports memorabilia auction will begin at approximately 2:30. Over 225 items will be auctioned, including valuable individual sports cards, complete card sets, sports publications, photographs, figurines, baseballs, and other memorabilia. Some of the memorabilia to be auctioned have been autographed by current and former stars from all sports. Bidders must be present to bid. No telephone or proxy bids will be accepted. Payment terms are cash, credit card (\$20 minimum charge, 3% fee), PayPal (3% fee), and local checks (with proper government-issued photo ID). In addition to the live auction, a smaller silent auction runs from the start of the card show until 1:30, when the winning bidder must be present at 1:30 to claim their item.

Proceeds benefit Ephrata youth sports programs and the Ephrata Recreation Center, in addition to Ephrata youth counseling and support organizations. The event helps enable Ephrata area boys and girls to participate in the local sports programs. The event also helps the Lions Club sponsor the 17U Ephrata Lions baseball team.

The card show also supports the Mountaineers' Table (community food program) and the Samaritan Counseling Center's TeenHope program (for the Ephrata Area School District). Exceptional Ephrata High School students are recognized via the Club's Senior Service Award, Students of the Month program, and a sponsorship for the Hugh O'Brian Youth Leadership Seminar).
