Friday, June 17th was an amazing day as we celebrated Lancaster Historic Club's inaugural charter night. One of



LIONS OF PENNSYLVANIA FOUNDATION

May 19, 2022

A meeting of the Board of Directors was held on Saturday, April 30, 2022 with 13 Board Members and 4 guests.

The treasurer's report showed that there was still in the account for grants a total \$120,327.42 with the expectation of adding \$125,000 on July 1, 2022. Our investment counselor discussed the fact that are investments decreased the last 3 months and that April may not be any better.

Five (5) Grant requests were reviewed and voted on:

- District 14-U and the West Penn Township Lions Club asked for \$3,030 for basketball equipment for the West Penn Recreational Park which would include handicap features. This was approved.
- 2 District 14-G and the Jersey Shore Lions Club requested \$13,250 for Antes Fort Village Park bathroom remodel. This was approved.
- 3 District 14-U and the St. Clair Lions Club requested \$4,790 to improve the Schuylkill County Fair Lions Equipment Shed. This was approved.
- 4. District 14-P and the West Goshen Lions Club asking for the Chester County Library Accessible Technology Project \$1,700 to improve access to the library for residents with low or no vision. This was approved.
- 5. District 14-P and the Honey Brook Lions Club needed \$3,250 for replacement of the main floor in the Lions Community Center making wheel chair accessibility better. This was approved.

We reviewed the 4 District requests for billboard grants, which was approved at our previous meeting. Those Districts making the request, and who also received \$500 each, are Districts 14-B; 14-E; 14-P and 14-U.

The LOPF website has seen a few updated changes and will continue to be updated as necessary.

Lion Jim Groff commented on the work of the Disaster Relief Committee and the wonderful remarks we are receiving from those who were recipients of our donations and equipment.

Requests for Fellowships and PIP Awards are still coming in but a little less than expected. Looking to see the swing upward as clubs close out Lion year the end of June.

We are still searching for an Executive Director and would like anyone interested to receive a pamphlet on what is expected.

The Disaster Fund Committee will be meeting on Saturday, July 9th at Claire's Family Restaurant in Morgantown for a discussion of handling of Disaster Funds in the future with LOPF

June 8, 2022

I. Opening-President Chapman

 PDG Gerald Chapman called meeting to order at 4:30 pm. Main purpose of meeting to review board meeting agenda items.

II. Misc, Business Matters

- Lion Deb Burkholder is filling in for Lion Bob McComas at the state office.
 President Chapman provided her with the dates of our board meetings for the rest of the year.
- Three new board member candidates will be voted on at the board meeting; PDG Gayle Padfield, PDG Fred Follard and Lion Carolyn French.
- PDG Dan Lombardo will be voted on to become Assistant Treasurer effective July 1, the beginning of the new Lions year.
- 2023 officer elections will take place at September board meeting. President
 Chapman indicated that he would be willing to stay on as president for another
 year in light of the need for new member development. The other current officers
 are willing to continue into 2023 also. Of course, other nominations can be
 considered as well.
- Lion Naugle will follow up regarding ad for state convention program. PDG
 Chappy noted that some changes to state convention procedures were made by
 PID Caballero and are outlined in the recent state council meeting minutes.
- Proposed by laws changes are due to PDG Neary or Lion Dougherty by July 31 so they can be added to the August retreat agenda.
- Some discussion about providing plaques for community grant projects. The
 consensus was that this should be encouraged in the grant process, however at
 this time the foundation will not provide them for grant recipients.
- Lion Atty. Panella brought Conflict of Interest forms for new board members to complete.

III. Grants Update

- Lion Dickson proposes 2023 grant budget of \$360,000 which would be six percent of projected assets.
- Grant applications are current. PDG Neary anticipates there may be a couple more that will be submitted by the end of June.
- PDG Neary reported that PDG Stambaugh has made progress on website changes but has not been able to reach Quantum to make changes or discontinue our relationship with them. They propose starting a new website on the WIX platform with our domain name. More discussion planned during board meeting.

IV. Financial Report

- Lion Dickson noted the budget for administrative expenses will be increased next year, mostly due to increased legal fees.
- As of the end of May, total assets at 5.1 million. The volatile stock market has
 resulted in losses through the first five months of 2022. The foundation will soon
 cross the one million dollar mark in dispersed grants since its' inception.



We've all heard about the "great worker shortage" — everywhere you look, businesses have help wanted signs hanging, and you hear about sign-on bonuses being paid by those who normally don't offer them and unusually high wages being offered. As the State Project that has a large number of workers to hire every year, Beacon Lodge has been impacted by these circumstances. Nursing, Kitchen, and Program departments are all significantly understaffed, despite a lot of effort and funding applied to recruiting.

Counselor DUTIES (Include but are not limited to)

- Understand Camp Policy and Camp Rules.
- Assist the campers in increasing independence, experiencing community membership, increasing social skills, building peer relationships, and increasing self-confidence.
- Cooperate with the entire staff in working together for the welfare of the camp and campers.
- Supervise and lead small and large group activities.
- Participate in the set-up and cleanup of games and crafts.
- Adapt activities, as needed, to allow active participation by the campers.
- Provide additional assistance (e.g., interpreting instructions, providing physical assistance (including personal care) in order to help the campers learn recreational skills.
- Prepare camper progress reports and award certificates.
- Ensure the facility is clean and safe.
- Other duties as assigned.

Cook DUTIES (Include but are not limited to)

- Understand and follow all Camp Policies, Camp Rules, DOH guidelines, and ServSafe guidelines.
- Prepare and serve meals.
- Maintain proper food storage.
- Maintain proper leftovers storage and utilization of leftovers per camp menus.
- Assist Kitchen Supervisor with food and supply inventory.

The Quarryville, PA Lions Club has made it their responsibility to honor military service by providing an annual Memorial Day observance for the local community, led each year by Lion Ronald Fichtner, a Vietnam veteran, honoring those who gave the ultimate sacrifice in past wars.
