

" It's easy to stay safe online."

Sometimes it's scary to be online. You don't kno ho is out there, tracking you and trying to steal your identity. Over the next 5 months, I ill let you kno of easy action items to help you protect yourself from identity theft.

Turn on multi-factor authentication

One of the quickest and easiest ays to stay safe online: **enable multi-factor authentication** on your accounts. This simple step takes j ust a fe minutes per account, and you only have to do it once. As soon as it's in place, it becomes tice as tough for hackers to gain access to your accounts.

What is multi-factor authentication (MFA)? Also knon as **to-factor authentication**, this idely available tool secures your accounts by requiring to pieces of information to log in. One common example of to-factor authentication: entering your passord and then typing in a onetime code sent to your email address or smartphone.

Other examples of a second step that may be used in to-factor authentication or 2FA include:

- A security question (for example, " What as the name of your favorite teacher? ")
- A biometric identifier such as your face or fingerprint

A temporary passcode you get via an authenticator application

You can typically enable multi-factor authentication by going to an account, going to settings and looking under security. You then toggle multi-factor authentication to " on" and provide any necessary information, such as your phone number or email address here you ant a code sent.

For example, here's ho to turn on 2FA on Facebook and on Google.





The Columbia Lions Club presented a check for \$800 to Old Columbia Public Grounds, a nonprofit organization that owns and operates Locust Street Park. The funds were donated by those who attended the August 19th Music in the Park concert. The Lions own and maintain the gazebo in the park. The Old Columbia Public Grounds Company had its inception in the desire of Samuel Wright, the town's founder, to do something of lasting benefit for the citizens of the town

The Columbia Lions Club donated \$4,000 each to three nonprofit organizations. Proceeds were from the Thunder on the River car show held on June 18.



Zion Hill Cemetery is the final resting place of several soldiers who fought with the 54th Massachusetts Infantry Regiment, the Union Army's first African-American regiment in the Civil War. The 54th Mass. was depicted in the 1989 movie Glory starring Morgan Freeman and Denzel Washington. Among those buried at Zion Hill is Robert Loney, a Civil War soldier and conductor on the Underground Railroad whose own family was among the first group of slaves freed in the early 1800s. The Columbia Historic Preservation Society in partnership with Columbia Borough has acquired the steward-ship of the cemetery with the goal of preserving this historic landmark and telling the stories of the forgotten men and women who played a significant role in shaping the history of Columbia and our nation.
