Message from the 1st Vice District Governor, Mike Schaeffer

This past weekend I had the opportunity to visit Leader Dog for the Blind in Rochester Hills, MI. The organization extends invitations to 1st VDG's to showcase their facility and provide information about services available to blind and visually impaired clients.

We spent the morning learning about history, the guide dog training process, facility capabilities and a personal tour from one of their clients. We had the opportunity to walk blindfolded with a guide dog as well as navigate the halls with a white cane. They were both challenging experiences, but I managed to not walk into anything. After their world-famous donuts and chili lunch, (that is not a typo) we headed across campus to tour the kennels and the rest of the facility. They have capacity to house up to 400 dogs and currently have approximately 150 on site, in various stages of training. Upon return to the hotel Sunday evening, we had dinner in the dark. Again, it was a challenging experience but somehow, I still managed to avoid my broccoli!



I was surprised to learn that only 10% of blind and partially sighted individuals utilize guide dogs. Much of this is believed to be due to lack of information being disseminated to potential clients. If you know of anyone who would benefit from a guide dog, please contact Leader dog at www.leaderdog.org. There is NO cost to clients for receiving a guide dog, including travel to and from the facility, housing and meals during the training.

Finally, if you have any interest in becoming a volunteer puppy raiser, there are opportunities to receive a puppy at 8 weeks and foster it until approximately 12-14 months. Your only requirement is basic obedience training and, of course, house breaking. The puppies then return to Leader Dog to begin their 4-stage training process. If you choose, you can become a perpetual puppy raiser.

I hope to see all of you at the upcoming region rallies. I've spoken to numerous Lions from various clubs in the past several weeks. Many of them were aware of the rallies but had no idea what they were. Region rallies are vitally important to maintaining the district budget. Monies raised from these rallies offset the need for district per capita dues. It is also a celebration of the previous year's achievements, where at least one member from each club will receive an award from IPDG Dick Sware. Please consider attending to support the district, celebrate individual achievements, and enjoy a night of fun, food, and fellowship!
