

It is my honor to be your LCIF Coordinator for this year. LCIF is our Foundation. Founded in 1968, the mission of LCIF is to "empower Lions clubs, volunteers, and partners to improve health and well-being, strengthen communities, and support those in need through humanitarian services and grants that impact lives globally, and encourage peace and international understanding."

Some of the grants that are available through LCIF are: SightFirst Grants, Matching Grants, Disaster Grants, Diabetes Grants, Hunger Grants, Childhood Cancer Grants, District/Club Impact Grants, and many others.

It is vital to know that, unlike other charitable organizations, ALL money donated to LCIF is used for the grant programs. NONE of the money is used for administration.

It is also vital to know that LCIF does not "send all the money overseas". During Campaign 100, July 2017 – June 2022, LCIF received a record \$324 million in donations. During that same time period, over \$440,000 was given in grants in Pennsylvania with over \$20,000 in District 14-D. Since LCIF's inception, over \$3.5 million has been given in grants in Pennsylvania with over \$230,000 in District 14-D.


