Hello Lions and Leos!



The Ephrata Lions Club will launch a new community outreach program aimed at veterans. The new program will be held at the Ephrata American Legion ballroom in Grater Park on Sunday Nov. 12 from 11 a.m. until 4 p.m.

The Lions currently have no veteran programs but plan to change that with what they hope to be their first annual veteran-related event.

Kicking off this new initiative the Lions will be hosting the first annual “Fundraiser” event that will give veterans a place to sell their wares, provide a venue for non-profit groups to support their causes of assisting veterans, and also to allow other crafters to sell their handiwork. FREE to VETERANS and NON PROFITS WHO SUPPORT VETERANS with a reserve fee. Other Crafters can lease tables for a \$50 per table fee or a “premium” L-Shaped table for \$65. The proceeds from table fees will be funneled back to veterans or veteran non-profit organizations at the end of the day.

Admission the day of the event is by donation or by bringing an item for the Stockings for Soldiers program. All cash donations will go back to support veterans in the community.

Music will be provided by Guitars for Vets on the ballroom stage from 1 until 3 p.m.

In addition, local New York Times best-selling author Larry Alexander will be present to sign copies of his military books. He will also have books available for purchase.
