Engaging prospective new members is simple. One of Lion Clubs initiatives is, "Just Ask". I'd modify that to, "Just Tell". Tell your friends, family, and neighbors what the Lions do. Tell them how they can have an impact on the community and tell them by sharing your successes on social media. And after you've told them how they can help, ask them to help with your next service project.



Items discussed

I. Community Project Grant Discussion

- President Chapman reviewed information provided by PCC Dietz and Lion
 Dickson regarding considerations for revising community project grant guidelines
 and restrictions. Some key points from group discussion are as follows:
 - 1.) Ownership and financial support from the sponsoring Lions club is important.
 - 2.) For renovations, do the Lions OWN the building or property?
 - 3.) Is there an indication that other funding sources were pursued?
 - 4.) Final reports from grantees should be mandatory.
 - 5.) Applications for the same project cannot be made more than once per year and organizations should be cautioned that past awards do not guarantee future awards and should not be depended upon as a budget item for any ongoing project.
 - 6.) Money should not be awarded for government projects or properties.
 - 7.) Grant awards should not be used for salaries or personal compensation.
 - 8.) Applications for vehicle purchases will be limited to a \$25,000 limit and may not be submitted from the same organization for at least five years.
 - 9.) No more than fifty percent of the total community project cost can be applied for.
 - 10.)PDG Stambaugh will revise web site to reflect what pages are required for each of the four grant type and the additional recommendations from the community grant discussion points.

II. Grants Report

Over \$430,000 was awarded in the past Lions year and for July of this year \$7,268 has been awarded.s

III. Finanical Report

Treasurer Lion Bob Dickson reviewed the year to date budget v. actuals report. He noted that \$2,672 was received in Lions Club contributions for July and expenses were \$280.

Total Assets as of July 31, 2023 was \$4,970,952

Lion Dickson reviewed proposed adjustments to the 2023-2024 budget due to increased costs in meals and other expenses decreasing. Proposed grant budget set at 6 persent of 2022-2023 average asset amount.

LIONS OF PENNSYLVANIA FOUNDATION

The Foundation held a meeting on Saturday, July 22, 2023 in Harrisburg. The meeting opened at 10am with the introduction of a guest from Camp Victory, Kate Stepnick, who provided the Foundation with a description of Camp Victory in Millville, PA. Following the presentation, the Foundation provided her with a check for \$500 in memory of our late Executive Director PDG Art Girio.

Our treasurer, Lion Mark Tomco, reviewed his report from 7/1/22 to 6/30/23. One item of interest was that the annual audit was performed and payment to the company in the amount of \$6,500 was sent. His report on the Disaster Account shows that we still have \$1,254.81 in the account which is unspecified. A total of \$12,692.22 was sent to the District in Kentucky to help in their recovery. This was money donated from clubs and various other sources for that purpose. As for the Grant Account, we started the year with a \$94,307.42 carry over, added \$125,000, and ended the year with a balance of \$104,787.62 to start the new Lion year. It was approved to add another \$125,000 to the Fund.

Approval of Grants, radio and billboard advertising for this Lion year was discussed. It was decided that we will provide \$5,000 to the Districts for radio advertising but will not honor any billboard advertising this year. We will only consider certain advertising on a one time basis and will not agree to a continuing program.

The Grant Requests considered and approved are as follows:

- A. District 14-A and a Malco Ero-Scan Scanner for \$2,142.61
- B. District 14-B and \$500 for Radio Advertising
- C. District 14-L and Billboard advertising \$500 (Submitted in May 2023)
- D. District 14-I&McConnellsburg Lions Club for Playground revitalization and a security system.
- E. District 14-N & Rochester Beaver Lions Club \$11,500 for replacement of retaining wall at Beaver County Lighthouse for the Blind.
- F. District 14-N & Union Township Lions Club \$3,996 for additions to Community Recreational Facilities at Scotland Meadows Park.
- G. District 14-N & Elderton Lions Club \$3,000 for Crooked Creek Braille Trail construction.

Election of officers was held. It was a unanimous vote to keep the existing officers for the year July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024. The officers are:

Our annual banquet will be held on Friday night, October 27, 2023, at the State Council meeting in Scranton. Our chairperson is PDG Bill Metschulat, with his wife PDG Cathleen Metschulat assisting.




