

FEEDING HUNGRY NEIGHBORS



When Lions see their community members struggling, they feel compelled to make a real difference. In Lowville, N.Y., Lions volunteer at a food pantry that serves up to 300 families each month. In this

remote area, many people live below the poverty line. And many do not have transportation to the nearest grocery

store, 20 miles away. For these reasons, the town food pantry is a vital part of the community.


The lifeline of the pantry was a passenger van, which was breaking frequently, resulting in costly repairs. Lions need The pantry can now serve as many as 450 families each month.

it to travel back and forth to a food bank 90 minutes away, pick up donations, and make deliveries.

Just as the van broke down for the final time, Lions received a nearly US\$20,700 Matching grant from Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF). With the funds, Lions purchased a cargo van and trailer and now can continue being a dependable part of their community.

Locals are thankful the pantry received this gift. "They help me out a lot when I need it," said one pantry patron. With the larger cargo space, the pantry can now serve as many as 450 families each month.

Elizabethtown Military Banners

The Elizabethtown Lions Club has been working on bringing Military Banners to the Elizabethtown Area since before the COVID pandemic. In 2023 the project went into full swing working with the Elizabethtown Brough, Mount Joy Township, West Donegal Township, members of the Rotary Club, and members of the community. The project became a reality.

We believe it is our civic duty to give back to not only the community but to our country. For those of us who served in the military, which is one way to give back. Phil Clark, a past Elizabethtown Brough Council Member authored a book titled "All gave some, Some gave all." It highlights military veterans from the Elizabethtown Area, two of which are Medal of Honor Recipients. It is amazing that this small community has two Medal of Honor Recipients. Several folks asked if you have to be an Elizabethtown resident or have been born and raised here to secure a banner. We are honoring any military veteran, no matter where they live or where they were born.


The community response has been outstanding. We currently have 240 banners installed with 90 more banners to be installed as time and weather permits which will complete the project. We have two sub-commitments in place. One is our Pole Cat Committee, made up of members of the community and the Lions Club. There focus is to identify utility poles that are acceptable for a banner. The second sub-committee installs the banners. This committee is made up of members of the Rotary Club and the Lions Club. A huge thank you to Glen Bootay, the owner of Waste Hauler Support Systems and a member of the Rotary Club for the equipment he provides and their work in installing the banners. He has worked tirelessly to perfect the hanging of the banners to the point it only takes approximately fifteen minutes to install one banner.

The banners are 29" wide and 60" long. The banners are placed on utility poles on major routes into and out of Elizabethtown. The banner is a high-quality canvas type material. Below is an example of a banner.
