#### District 14-D Jared Box Project

The Jared Box Project was started because of a kindergarten boy named Jared with childhood cancer from State College, Pennsylvania, who had an incurable brain stem tumor and dream to make other sick children smile. Jared noticed quickly that the other children, waiting for appointments seemed frightened and sad. He asked his mom if he could share his toys from his backpack with the other kids. To honor Jared after his passing, the Jared Box Project was started by Our Lady of Victory classmates and Cindy Kolarik, Executive Director of the Jared Box Project.

After hearing about the project, the Lions of 14-D decided to make Jared Boxes their service project for this year. District Governor Elect, Deb Keeports chaired the project. She recruited Lions Deb Bagnoli, Global Services Chair, and Betty-Jo Bowers, Childhood Cancer Coordinator, to help her lead this effort with a primary goal to give back locally to the children in Lebanon and Lancaster hospitals. "We had a lot of fun shopping for toys, ordering supplies, printing activity sheets, and creating a personal handwritten note for each child." Some of the following items were included in the Jared boxes for elementary children: Uno and Old Maid cards, which were Jared's favorite toys, along with socks, water bottles, colored pencils, coloring books, magic towels, and squishy toys. For Tweens with behavioral issues, the Lions Club made boxes with Squishmallows, origami kits, playing cards, and word searches. The items for the Jared Box project were purchased with a District and Club Community Impact Grant obtained from Lions Club International Foundation.

On June 4, 2024, members of Lions Club District 14 –D gathered to build Jared Boxes at the Willow Street Lions Club Community Center. A total of 160 Jared Boxes will be distributed.





Tables were lined with supplies for girls on one side and boys on the other side of the room. Lions Club members assembled boxes by lining the box with glittery tissue paper, then added a water bottle, toys, coloring books, crayons, Jared's activity sheet, and a handwritten note created by Lions Club members. The members added lots of fun stickers on the plastic lids and outside of the box to help bring smiles.



On June 10, 2024, District Governor Elect Deb Keeports, Betty-Jo Bowers, and Deb Bagnoli delivered the Jared boxes to the Penn State Pediatric Center in Lancaster. Leigh Anna Hilbert, as well as a group of providers greeted the Lions Club and expressed their gratitude and excitement for the Jared Boxes. They also expressed interest in receiving more boxes in the future and the possibility for a partnership with Lions Club for other community service projects. Boxes will also be delivered to Lancaster General Hospital and WellSpan Good Samaritan Hospital in Lebanon.

#### **Elizabethtown Military Banners**

The Elizabethtown Lions Club has been working on bringing Military Banners to the Elizabethtown Area since before the COVID pandemic. In 2023 the project went into full swing working with the Elizabethtown Brough, Mount Joy Township, West Donegal Township, members of the Rotary Club, and members of the community. The project became a reality.

We believe it is our civic duty to give back to not only the community but to our country. For those of us who served in the military, which is one way to give back. Phil Clark, a past Elizabethtown Brough Council Member authored a book titled "All gave some, Some gave all." It highlights military veterans from the Elizabethtown Area, two of which are Medal of Honor Recipients. It is amazing that this small community has two Medal of Honor Recipients. Several folks asked if you have to be an Elizabethtown resident or have been born and raised here to secure a banner. We are honoring any military veteran, no matter where they live or where they were born.


The community response has been outstanding. We currently have 240 banners installed with 90 more banners to be installed as time and weather permits which will complete the project. We have two sub-commitments in place. One is our Pole Cat Committee, made up of members of the community and the Lions Club. There focus is to identify utility poles that are acceptable for a banner. The second sub-committee installs the banners. This committee is made up of members of the Rotary Club and the Lions Club. A huge thank you to Glen Bootay, the owner of Waste Hauler Support Systems and a member of the Rotary Club for the equipment he provides and their work in installing the banners. He has worked tirelessly to perfect the hanging of the banners to the point it only takes approximately fifteen minutes to install one banner.

The banners are 29" wide and 60" long. The banners are placed on utility poles on major routes into and out of Elizabethtown. The banner is a high-quality canvas type material. Below is an example of a banner.


