THE DAY PDG RICHARD RUDY MET MELVIN JONES

The first time I met PDG Richard Rudy was at my official visit with the Elizabethtown Lions Club on November 12th. In speaking with him, he told me he had met Melvin Jones. When I heard this, I knew I wanted to learn more about this meeting. When I met with PDG Rudy on May 10th, he gave me a photocopy of an article from *The Lebanon Daily Times* which documents Melvin Jones' visit to Palmyra.

PDG Rudy joined Lions in April of 1950, when he was invited to attend a meeting and was told he had already been accepted, yet he told me he knew absolutely nothing about Lions. In the Fall of 1950, the Lebanon Region Lions clubs held their annual Region Rally with 300 Lions in attendance. PDG Rudy arrived early. He noticed a gentleman sitting by himself and went over to talk to him. PDG Rudy wanted to learn about Lions International. The two spoke for approximately 35-40 minutes. This gentleman seemed like an "ordinary Lion" to PDG Rudy. It wasn't until later in the evening when the guest speaker for the Region Rally was introduced that PDG Rudy realized he had been speaking with Melvin Jones from Lions International. PDG Rudy told me that Melvin Jones instilled "something" in him during their conversation that evening. PDG Rudy attended Lions meetings every night of the week except Friday night, when he shopped for groceries. Over the course of his 75 years as a Lion, PDG Rudy attended 15 Lions International Conventions and 60 State Conventions. Only one time did he travel outside the United States for an International Convention, that was to Korea. PDG Rudy is very proud of the fact that his club was the first 100% Melvin Jones Club in the United States. PDG Rudy started the North Annville Township Lions Club in 1977 and then formed his own club in 1980, the Greater Lebanon Valley Lions Club which dissolved in 2020 after 40 years of service to their community. At that time, PDG Rudy transferred to the Elizabethtown Lions Club where he continues to be a member. PDG Rudy served as our District Governor for the Lions year 1993-1994. PDG Rudy told me he has enjoyed every minute of his time as a Lion. He said "I'm here yet," 75 years later.

VisionCorps Announces New President and CEO

Paul Trunk, chair of the VisionCorps Board of Directors, announced recently that Megan Tomsheck will be the new president and CEO of VisionCorps.

"After a search process and interviews, the Board of Directors chose Megan, an internal candidate, to be the new leader of VisionCorps. We believe her enthusiasm, experience, and passion will continue to advance the mission and goals of VisionCorps both locally and nationally," said Trunk.

Tomsheck will begin her new role on Oct. 1. Dennis Steiner, current president and CEO, is scheduled to retire Oct. 31. Until then, said Trunk, she will be working closely with Steiner to ensure a smooth transition in leadership.

"I am extremely happy for Megan and looking forward to working closely with her over the next few months as she prepares for her new role as CEO at VisionCorps," said Steiner. "I've had the opportunity to watch her grow and develop into a strong and capable leader. I am confident that VisionCorps, under her guidance and direction, will continue to be a leader in providing services to people who are blind or who have low vision."

"Her knowledge and work experience at VisionCorps are big assets," said Trunk.

"Megan started at VisionCorps in 2007 and after working in both marketing and development, advanced to the Senior VP/Chief Development Officer," said Trunk. "She solicited the first \$1 million gift for the agency and organized Eye Drop, our annual signature fundraiser, which is on par to surpass \$1 million since its start in 2019."

Most recently, she led the agency acquisition of Little Rock, AR facility and business lines, increasing the number of employees by 50 and anticipated revenue by 10 percent.

"I'm looking forward to continuing the important rehabilitation work provided by VisionCorps to people with vision impairments," said Tomsheck. "We know the demand for our services is increasing as a growing number of individuals in Pennsylvania are likely to experience vision issues."

Tomsheck said she understands the changing nature of a social service agency and has experienced it.

"When I started at VisionCorps, we were only serving and offering employment in Lancaster and Lebanon. Since then, we've grown to cover five counties in Pennsylvania, began a new remote Professional Services Division (PSD), and added a facility in Little Rock.


"Employment has doubled since my start and our impact has grown substantially," said Tomsheck, who credited these accomplishments to the work of VisionCorps employees.

"Next year is our 100th anniversary and I'm very excited to build on the significant advancements we've made in service outreach and employment and lead this agency into the future."



WHY I GIVE STEPPING UP

Deb Keeports, District Governor for Lions Clubs of Lancaster and Lebanon Counties learned about community service at a young age. "My Pop-Pop was a member of Lions Clubs back when I was growing up. Years later, when the opportunity came for me to join, I said "Yes!" Lions International is well-known for supporting vision-related services, and local affiliates do a lot for VisionCorps.



"Without hesitation, my employer and co-workers stepped up to donate," Deb said. She works as a paralegal for Atlee Hall, LLP. "Other donors soon followed. I was really blown away by how much I was able to raise." She's now done two Eye Drops, and is planning her third next year to commemorate the end of her term as district governor in June of 2025.

For the 2023 Eye Drop, a local tattoo artist offered to donate proceeds to VisionCorps. At the suggestion of the COO from Atlee Hall, LLP, Deb and three of her co-workers stepped up and each got a tattoo. "I'm involved with adopting dachshunds that are rescues, so my tattoo was a Picasso-style dachshund," she said.

Her support of VisionCorps is also personal. "When my Pop-Pop got shingles in the 1970s, he was warned not to let it get into his eyes, but eventually it did. He didn't lose all his vision, but he had to give up his driver's license," Deb said. Later, her mother and uncle were diagnosed with macular degeneration. "Sadly, the one thing my mom loved more than anything was to read. I've since learned that I have some of the same genetic markers for macular degeneration."

Deb believes that attitude is everything. "If you experience a vision loss, don't be afraid to ask for help to regain your independence." There are organizations out there to help. If you know someone who is losing their vision, tell them about VisionCorps. Get involved. Become a volunteer driver. Donate. The thing is, you never know if you or someone you love is going to need these services in the future."




