In November, she attended a Zone Meeting, showing attendees how to report service in the portal. She is also attending another Zone Meeting in February to help show club members how to report service. The percentage of clubs now reporting service has jumped to 69%, well within my goal of 77% of clubs reporting service. Keep reporting! WHY I GIVE STEPPING UP

Deb Keeperts, District Governor for Lions Clubs of Lancaster and Lebanon Counties learned about community service at a young age. "My Pop-Pop was a member of Lions Clubs back when I was growing up. Years later, when the opportunity came for me to join, I said 'Yes!'" Lions International is well-known for supporting vision-related services, and local affiliates do a lot for VisionCorps.

"I had known of VisionCorps, but I didn't know about it," Deb said. In 2021, she invited Chief Development Officer Megan Tomsheck to do a presentation to her local Lions Club. "At the end of the presentation, when Megan reminded everyone about VisionCorps' Eye Drop fundraiser, our Past District Governor, Bill Grager, 'nominated' me to go Over the Edge!" Deb said. Bill's wife had done it twice. "The funny thing is, everybody thought that rappelling down the side of the Holiday Inn is what would get me out of my comfort zone. But the real challenge for me was having to secure \$1,000 in donations from sponsors. It brought back memories from high school: selling candy, magazine subscriptions, subs, and pizzas to support our band." She needn't have worried.

"Without hesitation, my employer and co-workers stepped up to donate," Deb said. She works as a paralegal for Atlee Hall, LLP. "Other donors soon followed. I was really blown away by how much I was able to raise." She's now done two Eye Drops, and is planning her third next year to commemorate the end of her term as district governor in June of 2025.

For the 2023 Eye Drop, a local tattoo artist offered to donate proceeds to VisionCorps. At the suggestion of the COO from Atlee Hall, LLP, Deb and three of her co-workers stepped up and each got a tattoo. "I'm involved with adopting dachshunds that are rescues, so my tattoo was a Picasso-style dachshund," she said.

Her support of VisionCorps is also personal. "When my Pop-Pop got shingles in the 1970s, he was warned not to let it get into his eyes, but eventually it did. He didn't lose all his vision, but he had to give up his driver's license," Deb said. Later, her mother and uncle were diagnosed with macular degeneration. "Sadly, the one thing my mom loved more than anything was to read. I've since learned that I have some of the same genetic markers for macular degeneration."

Deb believes that attitude is everything. "If you experience a vision loss, don't be afraid to ask for help to regain your independence." There are organizations out there to help. If you know someone who is losing their vision, tell them about VisionCorps. Get involved. Become a volunteer driver. Donate. The thing is, you never know if you or someone you love is going to need these services in the future."

LCIF Update

We are making steady progress toward our District goal of \$35,693. As of mid February we have donated \$17035 or 48% of our goal. Our goal breaks down to \$30.50 per member. Kudos to the Baron Stiegel Lions Club. Every member of their club has donated at least the requested donation of \$30.50. Which club is next???

The **Presidential Supporter pins** are available for anyone donating a minimum of \$50 to LCIF. Please let me know if you qualify for one of the pins. I will gladly visit your club to present the appropriate pin(s).

One of best ways to donate to LCIF is through automatic donation. No matter what the amount, a monthly donation will quickly accumulate. Once it's set up, it will continue to run. Think of all the good you can do by giving up one or two Starbucks each month. And, once you have donated \$1000, you can give someone, even yourself, a Melvin Jones Fellowship or a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship. If you need help in setting up the automatic monthly donation, please let me know.

Another way to make a lasting impact is to make a **Legacy Donation**. A Legacy Gift is a pledged gift that will be paid from your estate. That gift will be credited individually, to your club, and to the District. The pledged gift is credited during the year it is pledged and is counted toward the District, Multiple District, and Constitutional Area goals. It is not counted as credit toward a Melvin Jones Fellowship or Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship because the money is not yet realized and received by LCIF.

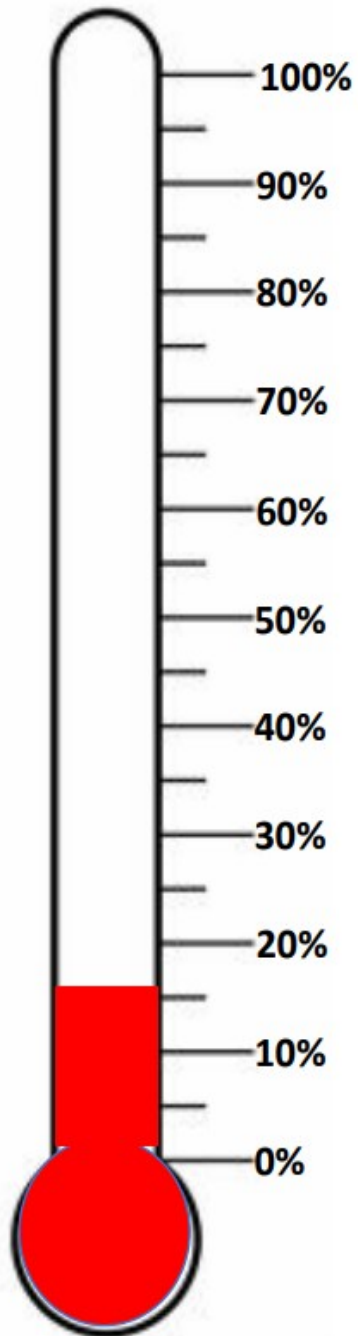

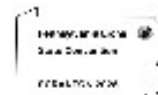

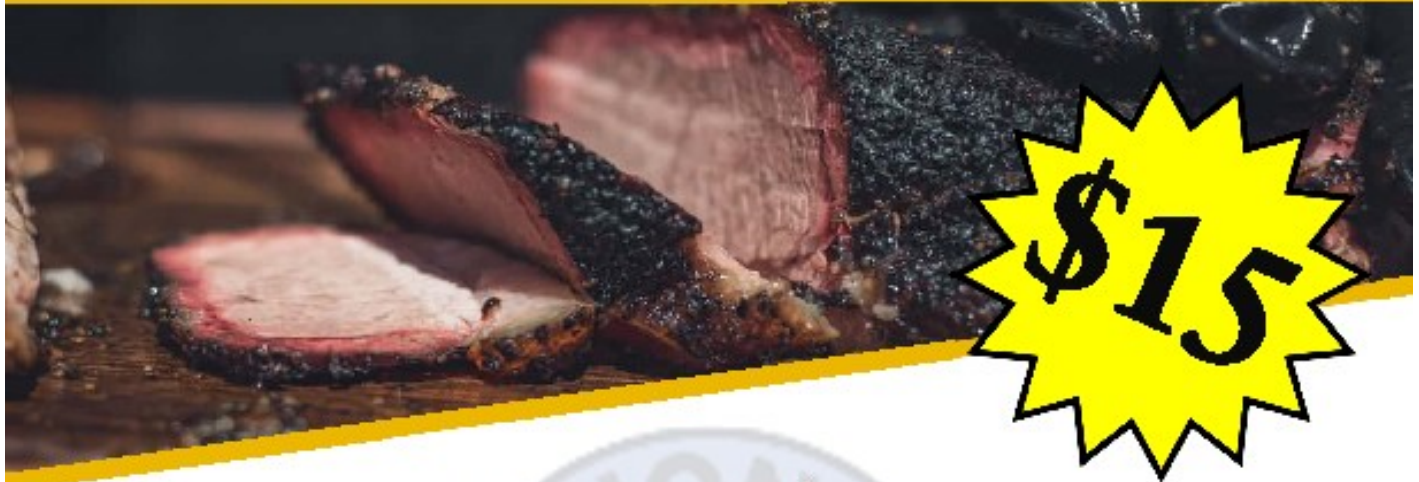
