
### A Message from District Governor Deb Keeports

### The Burden of Diabetes in Pennsylvania

Diabetes is an epidemic in the United States. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), over 38 million Americans have diabetes and face its devastating consequences. What's true nationwide is also true in Pennsylvania. Obesity is linked to up to 53 percent of new cases of type 2 diabetes each year. Treating the chronic disease of obesity can help prevent, delay, and even result in diabetes remission.

#### Pennsylvania Diabetes Epidemic

- Approximately 1,145,500 adults in Pennsylvania, or 11.1% of the adult population, have diagnosed diabetes
- Every year, an estimated 61,000 adults in Pennsylvania are diagnosed with diabetes.

#### Pennsylvania Obesity Epidemic

 Approximately 3,454,7000 adults in Pennsylvania, or 33.4% of the adult population, have obesity.

#### Diabetes is expensive:

Americans with diabetes have medical expenses approximately 2.6 times higher than those who do not have diabetes. And the total estimated cost of diagnosed diabetes in the U.S. in 2022 was \$412.9 billion, including \$306.6 billion in direct medical costs and \$106.3 billion in reduced productivity attributable to diabetes.

In 2017 it was estimated that:

- Total direct medical expenses for diagnosed diabetes in Pennsylvania was \$9.3 billion.
- Total indirect costs from lost productivity due to diabetes was \$3.5 billion.
- Total cost of diabetes was \$12.8 billion.

#### Obesity is expensive:

Americans with obesity had related medical care costs of an estimated \$173 billion in 2019. Having obesity more than doubles an individual's health care costs and out-of-pocket cost for care.

- A person with obesity or overweight with employer-provided health insurance had an average of \$12,588 in total yearly health costs, compared to \$4,699 for those without overweight or obesity.
- In 2021, a person with obesity with employer-provided health insurance faced an average of \$1,487 in out-of-pocket costs, compared to \$698 for those without obesity.

#### To aid the efforts of improving lives, preventing diabetes, and finding a cure:

In 2024, the National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases at the National Institutes of Health invested \$19,218,318 in diabetes-related research projects in Pennsylvania. The Division of Diabetes Translation at the CDC provided \$1,963,728 in diabetes prevention and educational grants in Pennsylvania 2022.

# WHY I GIVE CARL SPELLMAN

### Fostering Connection and Purpose Through Volunteering

"There is something very special about volunteering,"
Carl Spellman of Landisville said. "It's a great way to
connect with people. It gives you a sense of purpose." He
supports VisionCorps by volunteering with the Mount Joy
Lions Club.



Carl has a personal connection to the Lions and VisionCorps. His son, Patrick, was born with ocular albinism and is legally blind. When Patrick was 6, Carl learned about a Lions sponsored summer camp program for children with vision impairments. His son enjoyed the experience, and it motivated Carl to join the Lions. After Patrick graduated from law school, he got a job with VisionCorps, and is currently working for the federal government in Philadelphia.

"I was a Lions member in New Jersey for 29 years until my wife Jody and I retired and moved to Pennsylvania," Carl said. "Seven years ago, a friend from our church here invited me to join the Mount Joy Lions." He has enjoyed serving in many roles in his Lions Club including recruiting new members and obtaining featured speakers. "As a District Governor, I visited all 41 clubs in our district and encouraged them on their membership, fundraising, and service goals." One of the things he enjoys most about being in a Lions Club is the flat hierarchy: "Any member can step forward with an idea, a fundraiser, or a service project."

In 2021, Carl stepped backward — off the roof of the Lancaster Holiday Inn. He was helping to raise awareness and support for VisionCorps by participating in the annual Eye Drop rappelling event. "It sounds risky, but it's actually very safe and fun," he said. "I'm 74, and I'm thinking of doing it again. It's a good fundraiser."

The Mount Joy Lions Club also helps children entering Donegal Primary School get their eyesight checked through the VisionCorps Vision Screening Program, KidSight. "We publicize the service, and we're on site for three days checking people in. It's very satisfying to help," Carl said. "Parents sometimes don't pick up on the fact that their child has a vision problem, or they don't realize how severe it might have become. If they need financial help for an exam to get corrective glasses, VisionCorps will assist. Our club has been helping for around four years now, and we have established a good connection with the school to keep it going."

In addition to fostering a sense of community and purpose, volunteering gives back in other ways. "You're helping others, but you're also developing your own skills and building your own confidence with each successful project," Carl said. "I recommend it to everyone!" Since 1972, Four Diamonds was founded to support children and their families in the fight against childhood cancer. With a focus on care, support and research, Four Diamonds has created a diverse program that's helped more than 4,800 childhood cancer patients and their families over the years.

Through its mission, Four Diamonds ensures every child has access to superior medical care and comprehensive support to conquer cancer. Our mission is dedicated to funding innovative research to develop improved treatments and cures for every childhood cancer patient at Penn State Health Children's Hospital and around the world.

In addition to our research efforts, Four Diamonds covers 100 percent of all medical expenses related to cancer care not covered by insurance for eligible Four Diamonds children and offers 30+ specialty care providers dedicated to ensuring the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of the children and their families are met.

In 2018, Lions International announced a new international focus on pediatric cancer. Shortly after, the PA Lions Cares- For the Kids initiative was announced. Last year, the Pennsylvania Lions raised over \$36K towards helping Four Diamonds patients. This does not include any in-kind contributions to the hospital or supporting programs at the facility.

With a goal of \$50K in FY25, we are looking to expand. September is Childhood Cancer Awareness Month and there is no better time to get involved. If you haven't done so already, please consider the following:


