Missoula Lions Use Holiday Cheer to Support Independence

The Missoula Lions Club of Montana was chartered in 1927 and joined the ranks of Top Dog Clubs several years ago. Since 1945, their club has organized an ever-growing sale of Christmas trees to raise money for the causes they support. Their 25 members back their mission to provide people who are blind and low vision with accessible eye exams and glasses, and they have been a proud Leader Dog supporter for many years, empowering people to achieve independence.

On April 18th at the District Convention, attendees helped fill 250 personal hygiene bags for the homeless. Items in the bags included shampoo, soap, lotion, sunscreen, rain poncho, razor, shaving cream, socks, washcloth, hand towel, comb, brush, first aid kit, toothbrush, toothpaste, and deodorant.



Our district was able to participate in this project with a District Community Impact Grant from LCIF.



DG Steve also received a donation of 250 toothbrushes from Dr. Patrick Moran and Lititz Orthodontics

Thanks to all those Lions who helped fill the bags which will be distributed to organizations providing assistance to the homeless, including veterans who are homeless in Lancaster and Lebanon counties.

District 14-D Baron Stiegel Lions Club cleans up historic Erb/Steinmetz/Brubaker Graveyard in Elizabeth Township Lancaster County during the Lions International Week of Service: Environment project. This cemetery has head stones from 1793 to 1953 with the majority of surnames being Shenk, Brubaker, Erb, and Steinmetz. Baron Stiegel Lions have had involvement in caring for this cemetery since 1979. The club has partnered with scout troops and Trail Life for mowing and recently partnered with a neighbor youth to perform the ongoing mowing. The April 2026 project addressed years of fence-growth removal of trees and weeds. Five Club Members and Two guest volunteers joined together to complete the project on a Friday evening. There were six heaping John Deere Gator loads of debris hauled away from the fence line.
