





I feel I need to address an issue within our Multiple District 14. The critical challenge facing our Multiple District is the growing shortage of Lions willing to serve as Vice District Governors and District Governors. These leadership positions are vital for the continued success and vitality of our organization. They provide essential guidance, support, and oversight to our clubs and carry the responsibility of representing Lions Clubs International at the district level.



Our best scenario is when each of our 17 districts in Pennsylvania has a Second Vice District Governor, a First Vice governor, and a Governor who has served both of the Vice District Governor positions. As I write this article, MD-14 has seven SVDG and four FVDG positions vacant. Not only are there vacancies, but three districts have neither Vice District Governors' positions filled.

Lions may not fully understand the personal and professional growth opportunities that come with leadership roles, such as enhanced communication, problem-solving, and team-building skills. A Lion who accepts these leadership positions will receive invaluable training in these crucial skills. They may also be unaware of the positive impact they can have on their communities and the satisfaction that comes with serving others. Many District Governors bring service project ideas and fundraisers to their club or district that they learned from other Lions across the state.

Multiple District 14 Council Chairperson Michael Crossey has issued a call for the <u>2025-2026 Council of Governors</u> to hold its <u>first meeting Saturday</u>, <u>August 2</u>, <u>2025 at 2:00 p.m. at the Red Lion Hotel Harrisburg-Hershey</u>, 4751 Lindle Road, Harrisburg, PA 17111.

State Council will meet initially in a preliminary meeting at 10 a.m. at the hotel, followed at Noon by a complimentary "Lunch & Learn" presentation provided by the Northeast PA Lions Service Foundation. An RSVP form for the complimentary lunch may be found in this packet of information.

Prior to the State Council preliminary meeting, MD-14 Vice District Governors will also meet at 8 a.m. for their first training session of the 2024-2025 Lions year.

If your committee needs a room to meet on Saturday morning, please notify me by Monday, July 21, 2025. Meeting rooms will be given out on a first come first served basis. There are a limited number of rooms available.

Individuals desiring discounted overnight accommodations at the Red Lion Hotel Harrisburg Hershey should call the hotel's front desk at 717.939.7841 or use the link in this letter to book a room online. The link is PA State Council of Lions Clubs . A discounted rate of \$129/night plus tax is available. Please ask for the "PA Lions" rate when making your reservations by phone. The discounted rate is only valid for reservations made through Thursday, July 17, 2025.

Committee chairpersons/coordinators who have an <u>Action Item</u> for State Council to consider during the Saturday, August 2, 2025 Council meeting <u>must</u> submit that item in written form to the State Office <u>no later than Saturday, July 5, 2025</u>. Any Action Item proposal received by the State Office less than 14 days prior to a State Council meeting must be approved by a two-thirds vote (12 of 18) of the Council of Governors before it may be presented for consideration. An Action Item that does not receive the needed two-thirds vote for consideration will be tabled until the next State Council meeting. Committee chairpersons/coordinators with Action Items must be present or have a representative at both the Preliminary and Regular State Council meetings. Council Chair Crossey reminds everyone: Oral committee reports to State Council will be subject to a three-minute time limit.

State committee chairs and coordinators who do not have an Action Item for Council to consider are also asked to submit written reports to the State Office by Saturday, July 5, 2025 so they may be included in the packet of information for the State Council to review prior to the meeting.

#### Official Notice 2025 International Convention, Orlando, Florida, USA

The following proposed amendments to the International Constitution and By-Laws will be reported to the delegates for vote at the 2025 International Convention.

ITEM 1: A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE ASSOCIATION TO INCLUDE LOCAL TAXES AND FEES TO THOSE CLUBS IN WHICH SUCH FEES AND TAXES APPLY.

(THIS AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS REQUIRES A MAJORITY VOTE TO ADOPT)

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, That the International By-Laws, Article XII. Fees and Dues be amended by inserting a new Section 3 as follows:

Section 3. LOCAL FEES AND TAXES. In additional to any Membership Dues issued pursuant to Section 2. above, the association may levy additional amounts to address local taxes and fees imposed upon international dues by any governmental entities or tax authorities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Section 3. Carrying Charge, be renumbered as Section 4.

ITEM 2: A RESOLUTION TO REDISTRIBUTE THE NUMBER OF DIRECTORS BY REDUCING THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, ITS AFFILIATES, BERMUDA AND THE BAHAMAS BY ONE INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR IN EVEN YEARS AND TWO INTERNATIONAL DIRECTORS IN ODD YEARS; INCREASING SOUTH AMERICA, CENTRAL AMERICA, MEXICO AND ISLANDS OF THE CARIBBEAN SEA BY ONE INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR IN EVEN YEARS; AND INCREASING INDIA, SOUTH ASIA AND THE MIDDLE EAST BY TWO INTERNATIONAL DIRECTORS IN ODD YEARS.

(THIS AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION REQUIRES A TWO-THIRDS VOTE TO ADOPT)

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, That effective July 1, 2026, Article V., Section 3. be amended by deleting the existing language in its entirety and substituting the language as set forth below:



Section 3. COMPOSITION AND ELECTION OF INTERNATIONAL BOARD BY CONSTITUTIONAL AREAS. The International Board of Directors shall be composed of the president, immediate past president, the first, second and third vice presidents and directors, which shall be elected as follows:

In each even-numbered year, eighteen (18) directors shall be elected, consisting of four (4) from clubs in the United States of America, its affiliates, Bermuda and the Bahamas; two (2) from clubs in South America, Central America, Mexico and Islands of the Caribbean Sea; three (3) from clubs in Europe; three (3) from clubs in the Orient and Southeast Asia; four (4) from clubs in India, South Asia and the Middle East; one (1) from clubs in Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and Islands of the South Pacific; and one (1) from clubs in Africa;

In each odd-numbered year, seventeen (17) directors shall be elected, consisting of four (4) from clubs in the United States of America, its affiliates, Bermuda and the Bahamas; one (1) from clubs in Canada; one (1) from clubs in South America, Central America, Mexico and the Islands of the Caribbean Sea; three (3) from clubs in Europe; four (4) from clubs in the Orient and Southeast Asia; and four (4) from clubs in India, South Asia and the Middle East.

ITEM 3: A RESOLUTION THAT WILL PROHIBIT A DISTRICT GOVERNOR, FIRST VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR OR SECOND VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR FROM BEING MEMBERS OF THE SAME CLUB.

(THIS AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS REQUIRES A MAJORITY VOTE TO ADOPT)

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, That Article VIII, Section 7. District Cabinet, of the International By-Laws, be amended by deleting the existing language in its entirety and substituting the language as set forth below:

Section 7. DISTRICT CABINET. Each single and sub-district shall have a district governor's cabinet composed of the district governor, as chairperson, the first and second vice district governors, none of whom shall be from the same club, the immediate past district governor, and the following who shall be elected or appointed under procedures provided in the respective single, provisional or multiple district constitution: the region chairperson, the zone chairperson, secretary and treasurer or secretary-treasurer and such other club members as may be provided for in the respective district (single, sub- and multiple) constitution



and by-laws. PROVIDED, however, each respective district governor shall have the authority to determine whether the position of region chairperson will be utilized during his/her term. If not so utilized, the position of region chairperson shall remain vacant during said district governor's term. The respective district (single, sub and multiple) shall provide in its district constitution and by-laws for the elected offices of the first and second vice district governors, duties of said offices to be established by the International Board of Directors. A club member shall be elected or appointed as a region chairperson or zone chairperson only over the region or zone in which his/ her club is located.
















NURSING HOME VISITS







Re: PA State Sales & Use Tax Exemption Form

Date: July 7, 2021

Pennsylvania State Sales and Use Tax Exemption form awarded to the PA State Council of Lions Clubs for use by clubs during fundraising projects. This form is valid through February 2026 and may be duplicated as needed but **SHOULD NOT BE POSTED ON CLUB OR DISTRICT** websites or social media where it would be accessible by the general public. We do not want to risk losing the exemption as the result of improper use of this form.

Courtesy of Multiple District 14 Legal Counsel Lion Ashley Grimm:

"The PA State Council of Lions Clubs is registered in Pennsylvania as an Institution of Purely Public Charity under The Institutions of Purely Public Charity Act, 10 P.S. § 371.et seq. As such, it, and its subsidiary clubs, quality for an exemption from PA Sales tax. This means clubs are exempt from paying sales tax when they purchase goods or services. It does NOT mean they are exempt from remitting sales and use tax to Pennsylvania during fundraisers."

#### **NO LIQUOR IN RAFFLES!**

#### Liquor not permitted in basket raffles

**Please be aware:** A popular staple in basket raffles is a "no-no."

After researching the matter with the Executive



Director of the PA House of Representatives' Liquor Committee and the PA Liquor Control Board, MD-14 legal counsel Lion Ashley Grimm reported that "liquor is not permitted to be in a basket for purposes of a raffle. This also includes silent auctions.

"This equates to selling liquor without a license," Lion Grimm said. "A wine and spirits gift card is permitted to be included in a raffle basket, though." Lion Grimm's research supported the opinion expressed by Lawrence County Treasurer Richard Rapone in a recent New Castle News story that had prompted MD-14 State Council Chair Bill Morgan to contact Lion Grimm.

As part of the News story, Capt. Jamie Jones of the LCB Enforcement Bureau said including any type of alcoholic beverage – be it a six pack of beer, a bottle of wine, a bottle of whiskey or the like – is a violation of the Pennsylvania Liquor Code, Title 47, and is an unclassified misdemeanor offense. The fine upon conviction is \$500, levied to the organization sponsoring the fundraiser and not the donor of the basket.

In the News story, Rapone pointed out, under the state's small games of chance law, it is illegal to host basket raffles at fundraising dinners used to benefit someone who is sick.
